WEEK 2 (JULY 10-14):

'The Church and Non-Believers'

Our Lord's last words to his disciples were to go to all nations. The Church, from its very origins, was intended for all: it is Catholic, or universal. But this universal mission has raised many issues for the Church. How do we proclaim Christ's truth to a non-believing world? How far should we accommodate the

cultures and traditions of those we are evangelizing? How closely should we ally ourselves with secular authorities? These are the questions that the great missionaries of the Church have answered, not merely in theory but in practice. This living tradition will provide a strong and faithful foundation for The New Evangelization the Church has encouraged.

The fee for the course is \$175 per session, which
