



ORATORY SUMMER SCHOOL

July 7 – 11: *The Catechism of The Catholic Church*

July 14 – 18: *Jubilee Year in the universal Church*

Registration for the annual Oratory Summer School has opened. There are two sessions available. The first session offers a systematic introduction to The Catechism of The Catholic Church. The second session takes Jubilee Years as its theme, converging appropriately with 2025 being celebrated as a Jubilee Year in the universal Church and with the Toronto Oratory's own 50th anniversary, for St. Philip himself directed a confraternity dedicated to the care of Jubilee pilgrims in Rome. We shall study, among other topics, the theology and history of jubilees, Saint Philip's special association with Jubilees and the theme of the Church's Jubilee this year: Pilgrims of Hope. The cost for each session, which includes lunch each day for those attending in person, is \$200 per person. For those attending online, the cost is \$175 per person. 50th Anniversary -- Oratory Corner

One of St Philip Neri's titles is the Second Apostle of Rome. The first Apostle was St Peter. Apostle means "one who is sent." God sent St Peter to Rome in the first century to establish the centre of the Church at the centre of the Roman empire. St Peter preached until the end, until he was crucified upside down near the Vatican Hill. If St Peter was sent to establish the Church in Rome, St Philip was sent to protect Rome from falling away from Christ. While fulfilling this unique mission in Rome, especially through hearing confessions, St Philip's life led, almost without his intending it, to a new religious family, the Oratorians. His mission, St John Henry Newman, liked to say, was to be the Apostle of Rome. But his life resulted in, by God's providence, the congregation of priests and brothers we call the Oratory.

Often our lives have results we do not intend. We too are living under God's providence. We too are parts of Christ's mystical Body, the Church. Let us follow God's call and let Him shape our lives.
