

A traditional Lenten program includes elements of fasting and penance, prayer, and almsgiving. If you are thinking about what to do, these suggestions might help. *Fasting and Penance*

- Give up eating between meals.
- Give up drinking alcoholic beverages.
- Give up desserts, chocolate, salt & pepper, or other food group.
- Get up as soon as the alarm rings.
- Give up TV, movies, computer games.
- Give up recreational use of the internet.
- Take up some form of exercise.
- Go to confession.

Prayer

- Come to Mass on weekdays.
- Come to Stations of the Cross.
- Pray the Rosary.
- Read the Bible, the Catechism, or books about the saints.
- Spend some time in mental prayer.

Almsgiving (Works of Charity)

- Give to the parish or Share Life.
- Take time to visit relatives or friends in hospital or nursing homes.
- Write letters to relatives or friends.
- Join a parish organization (and plan to continue after Easter).

THE FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH, MARCH 19

Saint Joseph was by birth of the royal family of David, but was living in humble obscurity as a carpenter, until God raised him to the highest office ever accorded a mortal man, by choosing him to be the spouse of the Virgin Mother, the virginal father and guardian of the Incarnate Word. Joseph, says Holy Scripture, was a just man. He was innocent and pure, as became the husband of Mary; he was gentle and tender, as one worthy to be named the father of Jesus; he was prudent and a lover of silence, as became the master of the holy house; above all, he was faithful and obedient to divine calls.

O Glorious Saint Joseph, after the Blessed Virgin, you were the first to hold in your arms the Redeemer. Be our exemplar in our ministry, which like your own, is a ministry of intimate relationship with the Divine Word. 
