ORATORY SUMMER SCHOOL

Since 1989, the Oratory has offered a summer school for lay people. There are two week-long sessions. The first week is an introduction to the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The lectures are very well suited to anyone involved in teaching catechism classes or RCIA, school teachers, or anyone who wants to come to a deeper knowledge and appreciation of his faith. The topic for the second week varies each year. The first session is a prerequisite for enrolment in the second session.

There are three classes each day, taught by one of the Fathers of the Oratory. Mass is celebrated each day. The day begins at 8:30 a.m. and ends at 3:00 p.m. The fee for **the course is \$175 per session**, which includes lunch. For those who would like to avoid traveling each day, simple accommodation is available in the Oratory's Seminary Residence. The rooms are single, with shared bathrooms, and have access to simple cooking facilities and the Seminary Chapel. The cost for a room is \$75 per person, per week, and participants are responsible for bringing their own bedding for a single bed. Please note that the courses are aimed at adults and older teens.
