sometimes confused with her abbess, which is why she is often depicted in art incorrectly holding a crosier. She dedicated herself to her studies, becoming an expert in literature and philosophy. Her love for secular studies made the common life wearisome, pride and vanity ate away at her soul, and she soon became an unhappy young woman until Christ appeared to her. The day was branded in her memory; it was in her 26th year, when as she says "in a happy hour, at the beginning of twilight, thou O God of truth, more radiant than any light, yet deeper than any secret thing, determined to dissolve the obscurity of my darkness." From then on her biographer tells us "she became a theologian instead of a grammarian." She did not give up her intellectual ardor but now, all her labors were for her sisters, to cure what she termed "the wound of ignorance". Her many gifts and mystical graces did not prevent her from giving herself wholeheartedly to the common life with its joys and sorrows. In fact many of her special graces came to her as she took part in the ordinary routine of convent life.

St. Gertrude produced numerous writings, but only the *Herald of God's Loving-Kindness*, and the *Spiritual Exercises* remain today. She had various mystical experiences, including a vision of Jesus, who invited her to rest her head on his breast to hear the beating of his heart, and the piercing of her heart with divine love. It is interesting to note that Saint Teresa of Avila had a great devotion to Gertrude.

St. Gertrude is inseparably associated with devotion to the Sacred Heart. She also showed "tender sympathy towards the souls in purgatory" and urged prayers for them. In a vision Jesus told her, "*I accept with highest pleasure what is offered to Me for the poor souls, for I long inexpressibly to have near Me those for whom I paid so great a price. By the prayers of thy loving soul, I am induced to free a prisoner from purgatory as often as thou dost move thy tongue to utter a word of prayer*". The following prayer is attributed to her as from Jesus himself:

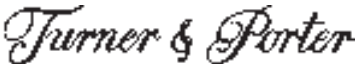
