THE CANONIZATION OF BROTHER ANDRE BESSETTE, SUNDAY, OCTOBER 17, 2010

Today we rejoice at the canonization of one of our own, Brother Andre Bessette, born

Alfred Bessette on August 9, 1845, in Saint-Gregoire d'Iberville, Quebec. He suffered from a chronic stomach ailment that kept him out of school and often without work. At 25, Blessed Andre could not read and his health was so fragile that the Holy Cross brothers, who received him into their community with some reservation, assigned him to be the doorman at Montreal's College of Notre Dame, where the congregation had just opened its novitiate. He once commented, "When I joined this community, the superiors showed me the door."

Despite the weakness that beset him, Brother Andre founded St. Joseph's Oratory of Mount Royal in Montreal and was known for his intense piety and famed for his miraculous cures which he always credited to St. Joseph. Rooted in his devotion to Saint Joseph and motivated by his compassion, Brother André dedicated his life to comforting those in greatest need, prompting the late Pope John Paul II to say, "We venerate in Blessed Brother André Bessette a man of prayer and a friend of the poor, a truly astonishing man.... In each age the Holy Spirit raises up such humble witnesses of the Gospel, who turn things topsy-turvy." Brother Andre died on January 6, 1937, at the age of 91.

If one were to seek the outstanding virtue of Brother Andre one would have to say that it was his humility. He once said: "I am ignorant. If there were anyone more ignorant, the good God would choose him in my place. " And when the power of healing was attributed to him, he responded: "It is St. Joseph who cures. I am only his little dog."

The significance of the life and work of Brother Andre is the fact that this humble Brother, who could scarcely read or write, was chosen by God as an instrument for good. As we read in the Preface for Martyrs, God reveals his power shining through our human weakness.

Brother Andre is the first canonized saint of the Congregation of the Holy Cross, a religious order known worldwide for their work in education and service to the poor. His feast day is January 6.

Saint Andre Bessette, pray for us.




