Our life of faith is all about choice. The people of Israel faced many moments on their journey where they were confronted with existential choices: good or evil, life or death. Joshua summons the people and invites them to make a choice to live for God. Joshua doesn't impose the choice on them. He chooses for himself: "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." The people responded: "Far be it from us that we should forsake the Lord... Therefore we also will serve the Lord, for he is our God."

Each day we are asked to make the same choice. To create a space in our busy lives where we are focused on God and what we are being asked of as disciples of the Lord Jesus. Not always easy but absolutely essential if we want to be true to the grace of our baptism. It is not an easy life and there is temptation to say its too difficult and walk away. Such a choice does not bring life. The Eucharist brings life!

LITURGICAL TEACHING: SUNDAY MASS Points to remember to avoid any confusion. Experts tell us we need to hear the message at least 7 times before it sinks in! 1. When the priest has finished the washing of his hands and turns towards altar, all stand and join "Pray sisters and brothers" 2. All kneel during the Eucharistic prayer. Following the Great Amen, all stand for Our Father, sign of peace and Lamb of God. After the Lamb of God, all kneel during the invitation: Behold the Lamb of God 3. Once the priest has received communion, all stand and remain standing until the last person in the communion procession has received. Approaching the communion minister, we bow our heads as a sign of reverence to the Eucharist. 4. Once the last person in the communion line has received, all may kneel or be seated. We do not wait until the Eucharist has been put into the tabernacle. Once you see that all the communion lines at the front of the church are finished, you may kneel or be seated. We do not have to wait for the last minister who is bringing communion to those with mobility challenges to return.
