January 23, 2022 Third Sunday in Ordinary Time A Message From Fr. Jim.....

Back to Ordinary Time. I finally have packed away all the decorations of Christmas and my living room looks very bare. It is sad that we tend to put away the Christmas spirit when we put away the manger scene. I wonder if we could all harness some of the spirit of the Season and greet one another and ourselves with a warm and enthusiastic attitude. What would it take for all of us to be more positive in our daily pursuits and our own consciousness other than a determined frame of mind that we put on each morning? Perhaps the recitation of the prayer of the Morning Offering would be a daily reminder to have a fresh outlook on the day and a cheerful disposition with each other. Try it and let's make a difference.

We were certainly lucky to have missed the snow storm that hit Toronto and area. I am reminding myself how I have come to live in the Banana Belt of Ontario. It is cold but at the same time not to have to wear boots and clean snow off the car is wonderful.

In our Gospel today we hear in St. Paul's letter to the Church in Corinth that as a people we are the Body of Christ. St. Paul was clear that we all have a calling to fulfill and we are called to do our work together. We are not in this as competitors but cooperators, working to bring about the Kingdom. St. Luke in the Gospel recounts the beginnings of Jesus' ministry. Standing among his neighbours he announces that his duty is to bring us to an awareness of the presence of God in our midst.

We begin today the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The way ahead into unity with one another, and so into closer union with Christ, is not always clear. In our earnest attempts to build unity ourselves it is all too easy to loose sight of this fundamental message of the scriptures: that God does not abandon his people even in their failures and divisiveness. Not only is this a message for Christians, but for the whole world. As the story of the Magi reminded us, God guides people of all kinds, with the light of the star, to where Christ, the light of the world, is to be found.

What is a Synod and What makes this Synod Different?

Since Vatican II, bishops have gathered every two or three years to reflect on important

issues confronting this Church, seeking to discern the voice of the Holy Spirit. In recent times Pope Francis has sought to invite broader consultation.

The Synod of Bishops in 2023 will be the culmination of a two-year synodal process for the entire Church that will shape the bishop's meeting in Rome 2023. This Synod begins with a diocesan listening phase involving all the faithful at local churches and dioceses throughout the world. This listening phase will run through to April 2022.

The goal of this synodal process is to involve as many people as possible in a worldwide process of intentional listening to each other, and listening to the Holy Spirit. The theme of the upcoming Synod is "For a Snodal Church Communion, Participation and Mission" defines how the synodality of the Church will be achieved.

Whenever we enter into dialogue, we allow ourselves to be challenged, to advance on a journey. And in the end, we are no longer the same, we are changed.
