MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

PASTOR'S CORNER ~ What is a parish?

In 1902, the new parish of Holy Family was established on King Street. On February 25, 2027 we will celebrate our church's 125th birthday! Over the next few months, I want to take a deeper look at what a parish is and why we have them.

The *Code of Canon Law* offers this definition: "A parish is a definite community of the Christian faithful established on a stable basis within a particular Church; the pastoral care of the parish is entrusted to a pastor as its own shepherd under the authority of the diocesan bishop" (No. 515).

1. Community of the Christian faithful = the parish is not first and foremost a building, but persons, Christ's followers.
2. Definite = from the Latin, finis, for boundary. The faithful of Holy Family are those who live in this geographical area or who regularly attend our church.
3. Pastor, its own shepherd = a priest representing the chief shepherd of the diocese, the bishop.
4. Bishop = successor of the Apostles. A bishop would ideally know all his flock by name, but this is not possible in large places. And so the bishop divides his sheepfold into territories, called parishes. He asks priests to act in his name for the spiritual nourishment of the faithful.
5. Diocese = administrative territories in the later Roman empire. The Church took over this terminology and often placed a bishop in these administrative centres. But what about people who lived far from the bishop? These faithful, gathered together as a family in God, gradually were called *ecclesia rusticana*, *parochitana*, and finally *parochia* or parishes.

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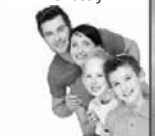
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
