If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

ORATORY SUMMER SCHOOL

Registration for the annual Oratory Summer School has opened. There are two sessions available. The first session offers a systematic introduction to The Catechism of The Catholic Church.
