MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

ORATORY SUMMER SCHOOL

There are two sessions available. Lectures will be at 8:30 a.m., 11:00 a.m., and 1:15 p.m. EST, with Mass at 10:00 a.m. Lunch is provided for those attending in person.

Session One (July 7-11)

A systematic introduction to The Catechism of The Catholic Church, The five-day course provides a solid foundation for navigating the Catechism on one's own, either for personal reading or for use in home schooling, RCIA courses, or Catholic schools. Although the course has been of great use to teachers and catechists, everyday Catholics find it accessible and intellectually nourishing. Even high school students have taken the course with their families.

The schedule of lectures for the first week is as follows:

- July 7: Belief and the Content of the Faith; Three Persons in One God; Creation, Man, and the Fall
- July 8: The Incarnation; Mary, the Mother of God; The Redemption
- July 9: The Holy Spirit and the Church; Life Everlasting; Sacramental Economy
- July 10: The Eucharist; Sin and the Sacrament of Penance; Moral Theology: Life in Christ)
- July 11: The Ten Commandments; The Ten Commandments II; Christian Prayer (1:15 p.m.)

Session Two (July 14-18)

The second week of the Summer School changes from year to year, allowing students to come back for new material each year. It is recommended that students take the first session before taking the second but not required. The second session takes Jubilee Years as its theme, converging appropriately with 2025 being celebrated as a Jubilee Year in the universal Church and with the Toronto Oratory's own 50th anniversary, for St. Philip himself directed a confraternity dedicated to the care of Jubilee pilgrims in Rome. We shall study, among other topics, the theology and history of jubilees, Saint Philip's special association with Jubilees & the theme of the Church's Jubilee this year: Pilgrims of Hope.

The schedule of lectures for the second week is as follows:

- July 1 4: The Gift of Forgiveness; Jubilee Years in the Old Testament: Leveticus 25; The Doctrine of Indulgences
- July 15: Rome as a Destination of Pilgrimages; The Catacombs & the Cult of Martyrs; The Excavation of St. Peter's
- July 16: !300 The First Jubilee in Rome; Early Jubilees up to the time of St. Philip; St. Philip & his Confraternity
- July 17: 2025 Jubilee: *Spes non confundit*; The Theology of Hope; St. Augustine on Hope
- July 18: The Holy Doors; Music Stuff; A Pilgrim Returns: Reflections on Rome in the Jubilee

The cost for each session, which includes lunch each day for those attending *in person*, *is \$200 per person*. For those attending *online*, *the cost is \$175 per person*.

Accommodation is available in the seminary for \$100 per person, which covers the entire week. More information and registration can be found here:
