The Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends!

It was deeply sad news to receive on Easter Monday morning that Pope Francis had died. He struggled so much in the past few months, yet he was determined to make an appearance on Easter Sunday to greet the people of God in St. Peter's Square. He came out in a wheelchair and waved from the balcony of St Peter's Basilica to cheering crowds below, saying: "Dear brothers and sisters, Happy Easter." His last words to us. He truly was a great leader for our Church the past 12 years. He ministered and served right to the very end.



This past February, Pope Francis wrote a preamble for a book by Cardinal Angelo Scola, entitled "Awaiting a New Beginning. Reflections on Old Age." Francis wrote, "... this gives us a consoling certainty: **death is not the end of everything**, but the beginning of something. It is a new beginning, ... because eternal life, is beginning something that will never end. And it is precisely for this reason that it is a "new" beginning, because we will live something we have never fully lived before: eternity." May Pope Francis rest in peace and rise in glory! May he have a blessed eternity!

On this Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday), the disciples



are locked in the upper room out of fear of the authorities. They thought the same fate that Jesus met, would be theirs also. The Risen Christ appeared through locked doors, and his first words were: *Peace be with you*. That greeting of **PEACE** was enough for these broken disciples, who were filled with fear! Then the Risen Christ

breathed the Spirit on them and told them to *forgive the sins of others*. *Imagine, t*he first thing Jesus did after he rose from the dead was *send his disciples out to forgive sins*. In the midst of their fear, anxiety and shame, Jesus restored them with the gift of his *peace* and told them to carry on his ministry of *reconciliation*. Of course Thomas comes to faith a week later when he declares, "My Lord and my God!"

This Gospel message is still pertinent today! We receive the same commission to be about the **ministry of forgiving**, the ministry of unlocking the door to our heart, and the door to other's hearts so they too can experience the freedom and healing of God's love. We are called to set people free by pouring on them **the same forgiveness** we have received from God. There's no better time than Easter, no better time than *Divine Mercy Sunday*, to put that **God-Given Forgiveness** into practice. We are reminded in the *Our Father* prayer, that we are only forgiven to the extent that we forgive others. Now is the day! Now is the hour, for the **real work** of Easter... for the real ministry of forgiveness. May the peace of the Risen Christ reign in our hearts and homes!

On the Second Sunday of Easter of the Jubilee Year 2000, at the Mass for the Canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska, Pope John Paul II proclaimed to the world that "from now on throughout the Church" this Sunday will be called "Divine Mercy Sunday." During his homily, he made clear that the Image of *The Divine Mercy* that St. Faustina saw, which is to be venerated on Divine Mercy Sunday, represents the Risen Christ bringing

mercy to the world. Pope John Paul II said: "Jesus shows His hands and His side to the Apostles. He points to the wounds of the Passion, especially the wound in His Heart, the source from which flows the great wave of mercy poured out on humanity." Divine Mercy Sunday is the Octave Day of Easter, a day that celebrates the merciful love of God shining through the whole Easter Triduum and the whole Easter mystery. It is a day of declaration of reparation for all sin, thus the Day of Atonement.
