

Dear Friends:

Today is the 3rd Sunday in the Easter Season! The days are getting warmer, and everything is bursting forth with new life! Resurrection everywhere! This time of year gives us that extra boost we need. Sadly, this week we lost one of our very dedicated and life-long parishioners, John MacDonnell. John was a daily Mass attendee and a faithful server at our Funeral Masses. He will be deeply missed around St. Pat's, as he goes to join his dear wife Helen. This is *Catholic Education Week*. Praise God we still have the opportunity to form and nurture our students through a faith-based education. Their eyes were opened, and he vanished from their sight! They left immediately for Jerusalem to share the Good News! The disciple's true understanding of the Resurrection comes as Christ breaks open the Scripture... and then Breaks Bread with them! Isn't this what every Eucharistic Liturgy does... and has been doing for centuries? May we never underestimate the power of God's Word, and the power of God's Sacraments! Christ still speaks to us in the same way he did that Easter evening. Without the regular hearing of God's Word, and the nourishment by his Body and Blood, it is very hard to find direction for our Christian lives. It is through being fed that we can go out and be people of Good News... people with a vision, people with hope... people who feed others! Have a blessed week!
