### Update on Church Lighting

This past week Peninsula Electric was here and replaced all the lighting in our church with the highest quality LED lighting. Our supplier and consultants are from Graybar. All the incandescent and florescent lighting are no more! Believe it or not, there are 134 bulbs in the church! These will be much cheaper to operate, and each bulb is guaranteed for 5 years. We will also receive a rebate from the provincial government. We also repaired several faulty sockets throughout the church, and the candle lights above the altar. We installed a switch for the lights in the ushers room, and we are now in the process of having additional outlets installed in the sanctuary, sacristy, and in the church entrance. Someone asked me, "What's next to be done?" Well, the speakers in the main body of the church are 15 years old, and can certainly be updated to more modern speakers. This will certainly improve the sound. Because of the echo in our church, (previously cushioned by carpeting), it is very difficult to get the right sound. So much depends on the speaking voice of the persons using the sound system. We are currently consulting the sound experts to see what can be done! Bear with us, and we will keep you updated!

In the summer months, we are looking at replacing all the hardware on our pews and repairing several kneelers. With the salt that comes in on our boots, most of the brackets have rusted. Many thanks for your generosity to St. Pat's, which enables us to get all these projects completed.

## Today is Divine Mercy Sunday



In 1905, a young Polish girl (Faustina Kowalska) was born into a poor but devout family. As a teenager, she entered the *Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy* in Warsaw. Because she was uneducated, Faustina was assigned the most menial tasks. Yet while cooking, baking, gardening, and housekeeping, Faustina underwent many mystical experiences during which Our Lord asked her to become both His apostle and His secretary, to announce anew to all people the Gospel of God's mercy. She died in 1938. In one of Christ's

messages to her, He said: *Humankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to My mercy.* 

Faustina was told that the Church should celebrate a feast in honor of the divine mercy on the **Sunday after Easter**. Not by accident does the Church, on that day, read the Gospel text that recounts Christ's institution of the Sacrament of Penance, which is the surest and clearest sign of the divine mercy. Faustian wrote down two prayers dictated to her by the Font of Mercy Himself. The first: *Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for my sins and those of the whole world.* The second: *For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on me and on the whole world.* On April 30, 2000 (Divine Mercy Sunday) Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina and designated the Sunday after Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday (*Dominica II Paschae seu de divina misericordia*). Pope John Paul II died during the <u>vigil</u> of the Divine Mercy Sunday 2005.
