Dear Friends,

Summer is slipping away. Before long our children will be back to school, and our young adults off to University and College! The Summer Olympics are over... and Canada's athletes did extremely well! Before we know it, Hockey Season will be upon us!!! Let's all take some precious time the next couple of weeks to relax and enjoy the beauty of nature out there.



As in the past three weeks, the Gospels for the next two Sundays are devoted to John 6, the **discourse on the Bread of Life**. Today's Gospel gets right to the heart of the Eucharistic message when Jesus says, *"The bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh... Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His Blood you have no life in you."* Jesus doesn't just speak about people believing in him, he wants us **to be nourished** by his very self, the Body and Blood of Christ! Without that,

we are spiritually dead... you have no life in you! I've heard many people say things like, Oh, I believe in Jesus... and all that... I pray at home, and at work, I pray the Rosary... try to do good things... I just don't go to Mass! Well, my answer to that is, how can one expect to be 'spiritually alive' if one fails/refuses to be nourished by God's Word, and by the Body and Blood of His Son on a regular basis? So many parents do not bring their children to Mass! So many children celebrate their First Holy Communion, and if it wasn't for School Masses, there would be no second Communion! That's sad. So many couples want a big show at their Church Wedding, and we never hear from them again until there's a baptism! I don't know the answer. I can just repeat what Jesus said: Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His Blood you have no life in you.

On the night before he died, Jesus, the true bread from heaven, replaced the former bread from heaven, the Manna and Law, and ratified the Old Testament Covenant with his Broken Body and poured-out Blood. The place where we Roman Catholic believers encounter the true bread from heaven is in the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the action where we share the redemptive mystery of the Cross. It is through the Eucharist that we share in eternal life. Maybe for the next two weeks, we can take some extra time to reflect on the importance of the Eucharist for our spiritual journey! And maybe consider inviting someone to come to Church... a child, a grandchild, a neighbour? Have a blessed week!
