All Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses are **PRE-REGISTRATION ONLY**!!! Each individual **must** have a pew pass to attend. Please call the parish office to pre-register **9:00 AM** to **2:00 PM Monday** to **Friday**. You can pick up your passes at the parish office. These passes are numbered and colour-coded for each Mass. Pews are pre-assigned. Only 110 people are permitted in the pews or in the Gym at each Mass. If **passes are not picked up by December 23rd**, they will be re-issued to those on the waiting list.
