

The Pastor's Pon

Dear Friends:

It is good to be back again. I spent the last two weeks with my mother in Newfoundland. She is still in declining health, having experienced a third fracture to her spine. This has limited her mobility. Please continue to keep her in your prayers.

Today, February 11th, is World Day of the Sick! This was started in 1993 by Pope John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes. Pope Francis recently wrote the following, "Jesus bestowed upon the Church his healing power. The Church's mission is a response to Jesus' gift, for she knows that she must bring to the sick the Lord's own gaze, full of tenderness and compassion. Health care ministry will always be a necessary and fundamental task, to be carried out with renewed enthusiasm by all, from parish communities to the most largest healthcare institutions. We cannot forget the tender love and perseverance of many families in caring for their chronically sick or severely disabled children, parents and relatives. The care given within families is an extraordinary witness of love for the human person; it needs to be fittingly acknowledged and supported by suitable policies. Doctors and nurses, priests, consecrated men and women, volunteers, families and all those who care for the sick, take part in this ecclesial mission. It is a shared responsibility that enriches the value of the daily service given by each." We each have a role to play in caring for those who are ill. Every Mass at St. Pat's, we remember those who have asked for our prayers. We pray for all who are hospitalized. We can never underestimate the power of prayer for those who are ill. We learn from the Master Himself in today's Gospel! Jesus heals a man with leprosy. His actions were so powerful! Moved with pity, Jesus stretched out his hand, and touched the leper, and cured him! In touching him, Jesus rendered himself ritually unclean, but he didn't care! That's what love does. He looked beyond the law, saw a human soul in misery, and healed him with his loving touch.

How do I approach the untouchables and outcasts, and those whom I find difficult to love? Whom do I render unclean? Or judge unfit? Or ostracize? We are to touch and support not just the physically sick, but all those whose lives are hurting and need healing in any way. Feeling pity, and showing mercy and compassion are Christian qualities of great minds and large hearts. May we never forget that God is always ready to show us his mercy and to free us from whatever makes us unwell. Have a healing week!

Ryan's Bowl Food Program "A Lenten Sacrifice" for St. Pat's!

The other 10% is used for school fees for the most desperate, a school uniform to replace the most tattered, also notebooks and pencils, and in dire cases, to purchase a goat for very needy families.
