#### FROM THE PASTOR

Today is the Feast of the *Presentation of the Lord*. According to the Jewish custom, Mary must be purified, forty days after Jesus' birth. After

this purification ritual, Mary and Joseph present Jesus to the Lord, as required by the Law.

Luke's Gospel tells us that in the temple they met Simeon and Anna. Simeon, a man led by the Spirit, had been longing for the salvation promised by God. When

he saw the Holy Family, he took the baby Jesus in his arms and prayed with fervor; thanking God for the joy of meeting the long-awaited source of salvation for the whole world. He recognizes Jesus as both the glory of Israel and the "light" to the Gentiles. Anna, too, recognizes in the child Jesus a source of great joy because of the redemption that will come to the world because of him.

This feast of the Presentation of the Lord is a great day for us to be rejuvenated in our faith, to be excited about God. Is Jesus really a big part of my life, or do I only call on him when things are not going well? Do I get excited about my salvation? Or do I take it for granted? Do I keep my faith to myself or do I share it with others? Do I, like Mary and Joseph follow all the customs of my Religion... or do I merely pick and choose what suits me, or what I agree with? Some great questions to ask ourselves on this Feast? May the Holy Family watch over all of us! And may we present to God the very best of ourselves! Have a blessed week.

# Candlemas Day

*Candlemas Day* is another name for the feast of the Presentation of the Lord. The Presentation is a proclamation of Christ- Messiah and Priest, Lord and Savior. He is the light who came into this world to dispel sin and darkness. Traditionally, since the seventh century, candles have been blessed at Mass this day that will be used throughout the year, hence coining the term "Candlemas." As we consider the feast of the Presentation, we remember that our parents presented us at church for our baptism. We were dedicated to God, and given the name, "Christian." We also received a lit candle from the paschal candle, at which the priest said, "You have been enlightened by Christ. Walk always as a child of the light and keep the flame of faith alive in your heart. When the Lord comes, may you go out to meet Him with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom." Therefore, as a light, each of us must bear witness to Our Lord. We must be the beacon that guides others to Christ.

# St. Blaise

Monday, February 3<sup>rd</sup> is the Feast of **St. Blaise**. **W**e will have a Blessing of Throats after all Masses this weekend (during the closing hymn), and also on Monday after the 8:00 AM Mass.

(St. Blaise was a physician and bishop of Sebastea in historical Armenia who is venerated as a Christian saint and martyr. Blaise is venerated as a saint in the Roman Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, and Oriental Orthodox churches and is the patron saint of wool combers and throat disease.)

When it storms and snows on Candlemas Day, Spring is not far away. But if it's bright and clear, Spring is not yet near!

## Did You Know?

In many Eastern European countries, the feast of the Presentation officially closes the celebration of Christmas. For this reason, Pope St. John Paul II began the custom of keeping the Nativity scene in St. Peter's square until February 2.

Candlemas Day also was important in the lives of farmers. An old English song went as follows: "If Candlemas be fair and bright, / Come, Winter, have another flight. / If Candlemas brings clouds and rain, / Go, Winter, and come not again." So if the bright sun "overshadows" the brightness of Candlemas Day, there will be more winter. However, if the light of Candlemas Day radiates through the gloom and darkness of the day, the end of winter is near.
