We gathered at her retirement residence for several family celebrations. We had a lot of fun, music and feasts! It was great to get home, to see everyone, and to enjoy Newfoundland cuisine: Jiggs Dinner, Scallops, Cod, Crab, Rabbits, Turrs, and Moose. Fr. Joi held the fort very well! Not that I ever had a doubt. We are truly blessed to have him here at St. Patrick's. Many thanks to Fr. Michael and Fr. Bill for assisting at Masses.

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the *Presentation of the Lord*. This Feast falls on a Sunday every seven years! According to the Jewish custom, Mary had to be purified, forty days after Jesus' birth. After this purification ritual, Mary and Joseph present Jesus to the Lord in the Temple at Jerusalem, as required by the Law.

Luke's Gospel tells us that in the temple they met Simeon and Anna. Simeon, a man led by the Spirit, had been longing for the salvation



promised by God. When he saw the Holy Family, he took the baby Jesus in his arms and prayed with fervor; thanking God for the joy of meeting the long-awaited source of salvation for the whole world. He recognizes Jesus as both the glory of Israel and the "light" to the

Gentiles. Anna, too, recognizes in the child Jesus a source of great joy because of the redemption that will come to the world because of him.

This feast of the Presentation of the Lord is a great day for us to be rejuvenated in our faith, to be excited about God. Is Jesus really a big part of my life, or do I only call on him when things are not going well? Do I get excited about my salvation? Or do I take it for granted? Do I keep my faith to myself or do I share it with others? Do I, like Mary and Joseph, follow all the customs of my Religion... or do I merely pick and choose what suits me, or what I agree with? Candelmas Day

Candlemas Day is another name for the feast of the Presentation of the Lord. The Presentation is a proclamation of Christ- Messiah and Priest, Lord and Savior. He is the light who came into this world to dispel sin and darkness. Traditionally, since the seventh century, candles have been blessed at Mass this day that will be used throughout the year, hence coining the term "Candlemas." As we consider the feast of the Presentation, we remember that our parents presented us at church for our Baptism. We were dedicated to God, and given the name, "Christian." We also received a lit candle from the paschal candle, during which the priest said, "You have been enlightened by Christ. Walk always as a child of the light and keep the flame of faith alive in your heart. When the Lord comes, may you go out to meet Him with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom." Therefore, as a light, each of us must bear witness to Our Lord. We must be the beacon that guides others to Christ.

St. Blaise

Monday, February 3rd is the Feast of **St. Blaise.** We will have a Blessing of Throats after each Mass this weekend (during the closing hymn). We will also offer a blessing of throats at the end of Mass on Monday morning. (St. Blaise was a physician and bishop of Sebastea in historical Armenia who is venerated as a Christian saint and martyr. Blaise is venerated as a saint in the Roman Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, and Oriental Orthodox churches. He is the patron saint of wool combers and throat disease.)



Groundhog Day is Sunday, February 2nd. What will the groundhog say? Will winter last another 6 weeks? The tradition of Groundhog day began in the 18th century. It is said that if the groundhog sees its shadow on February 2nd, there will be six more weeks of winter. In North America the most famous groundhogs are **Punxsutawney Phil** from the United States

and Wiarton's Willie from Canada. May the snow block their holes and prevent them from surfacing!!! With the rising price of meat, they'll probably be afraid to surface this year! ©
