Dear Friends:



World Day of the Sick and Our Lady of Lourdes Tuesday, February 11th is World Day of the Sick. Pope John Paul II initiated the day in 1992 to encourage people to pray for those who suffer from illness and for their caregivers. The Holy Father himself had been diagnosed with Parkinson's a year before, and it is considered that his own illness was impetus for his designation of the day. World Day of the Sick was first observed on February 11, 1993. This is also the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, which is another title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in honour of the apparitions that took place in and around Lourdes, France, by a young girl called Bernadette Soubirous in 1858. People have been traveling to Lourdes seeking healing for many years.
