Dear Friends,

We look at the News since 2020 started, and we quickly see that the world is in a fine mess. Assassinations, Missiles, Fires, Plane Crash. It's a lot to bear. We pray for world peace at every Mass... in every church! And nothing seems to change. We are left with big 'why' questions. Why is there so much hatred? Why are there so many tragedies? God bless all the victims of war. God be with the souls of the Ukrainian Plane Crash, and their families. It breaks our hearts to see 63 Iranian-Canadians among the dead. Returning to Canada from visiting their families. Brutally sad. May God send a healing rain across the land of Australia during these devastating Bush Fires, some believed to have been intentionally started. We remember those who lost their lives, those who lost every earthly possession- homes, businesses, farms, animals. We must never lose faith in praver. Keep praving, and keep working toward peace in our own families. That's a good place to start.

Today is the feast of The Baptism of the Lord. We jump ahead 30 years from the Manger to the Jordan! Being a member of the *Body of Christ*, the Church, does everyone out there know that I am a baptized Christian by how I live and act and love? Where I live and work and socialize... is it more human, more sacred, more loving, more Christ-like, because I am there? These are questions worth pondering. And of course, the ultimate question is: Can God say out loud about you and me, "This is my beloved son/daughter, with whom I am well pleased?" If not, maybe it's time for a good old Christian renewal! We enter once again into the Church's Liturgical Season of Ordinary Time until Lent! Maybe we can turn our lives into something Extra-Ordinary! God bless!
