The Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends in Christ:

Last week we celebrated the Baptism of the Lord. And we had the opportunity to renew our Baptismal Promises! Of course, only after his Baptism at the age of 30, did Jesus begin to **BE** the Messiah in very physical and public ways!



Today's Gospel presents Jesus' first miracle, *The Wedding Feast at Cana!* In this miracle we see his love, concern and generosity. As the wedding went on, the wine ran out. It must have been quite an embarrassment for the couple. So Mary brought it to Jesus' attention, and after a few words with his Mother, Jesus showed his glory! He performed the miracle of

turning water into wine. Not just one bottle... but 600 litres! And the wine was a very fine wine! He did not let the bridegroom or the guests down. He rescued them in their difficulty. This miracle not only revealed his glory but it led the disciples to believe in him. Jesus does not let any of us down either. He can do infinitely more than we can imagine.

Do we let him down? St. Paul reminds us in our 2nd Reading that God's gifts to individuals **are not meant** primarily for personal use, but for the service of others. He tells of the many gifts of the Holy Spirit to each person, **"to each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good,"** not for personal profit. The Spirit is supposed to be manifested in the baptized! Do we act that way? Do others see that? Do my neighbors know that? What gifts do I have? What has God bestowed on me? ... what am I good at? Am I using my gifts for my own personal profit or do I use them for the service of others? ... my time, talent and treasure? Imagine, if we used the gifts we have for the common good – even the gifts of **praying, singing, teaching, caring, sharing, encouraging, supporting, motivating**, -- then these gifts will grow and soon we'll see more miracles. Service to others and concern for others is the beginning of **all miracles**.

Now, go and share that Good News! Be good wine, deep love, deep concern, compassion and joy for others! **Be miracle workers!** May we allow God to turn any self-centeredness into service! Have a blessed week!

World Day of Migrants and Refugees

Today is World Day of Migrants and Refugees. Pope Francis recently wrote, "... In an age of such vast movements of migration, large numbers of people are leaving their homelands, with a suitcase full of fears and desires, to undertake a hopeful and dangerous trip in search of more humane living conditions. Often, however, such migration gives rise to suspicion and hostility, even in ecclesial communities, prior to any knowledge of the migrants' lives or their stories of persecution and destitution. In such cases, suspicion and prejudice conflict with the biblical commandment of welcoming with respect and solidarity the stranger in need. Jesus Christ is always waiting to be recognized in migrants and refugees, in displaced persons and in exiles, and through them he calls us to share our resources, and occasionally to give up something of our acquired riches. Pope Paul VI spoke of this when he said that "the more fortunate should renounce some of their rights so as to place their goods more generously at the service of others."

REFUGEE UPDATE

We are still awaiting the arrival of our first refugee family. We received a note two weeks ago from Immigration and the Visa Office in Beirut, "I am glad to inform you that Immigration has confirmed the approval of your application to sponsor Ayman Krait, Principal Applicant, with a family size of 3. (Ayman, Suzyi and Stephanie.) With a few more odds and ends, the house will be ready for this family. Hopefully they will arrive soon, and begin their transition among us. Our other application (family of 4) has been received and is awaiting official approval (Bassem, Alma, Celena and Alexandr). It has been highly recommended by our Diocese and by our Refugee experts, that we house the two families together for a period until they are more settled. We can only imagine how traumatized they must be, having been driven from their homeland, having witnessed some horrible things, and then having been in a Refugee Camp in Lebanon for some 18 months. We have a four-bedroom house on Maple Street which can accommodate both families for a period. We still have some furniture to pick up from parishioners. We have also received a lot of clothing donations from our parishioners. Many thanks. Once we know the exact sizes of the 4 adults and 3 children we will publish it in the bulletin.

We had a Refugee Meeting this past Monday evening, during which a wellseasoned Refugee sponsor was present to answer our questions, and to give us a sense of what to expect when our families arrive, and how to make the transition easier for the families. We then had a tour of the furnished house, and there was such enthusiasm about what St. Patrick Parish has been able to do in such a short time! God bless you for your ongoing support.
