The Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends: Today's Gospel is a great "**call**" story. After Jesus was baptized, and after John the Baptist had been arrested, Jesus began his earthly ministry in a very public way. To help with his mission, whom did he call? The elite of Jerusalem? **No!** A bunch of CEO's? **No!** A group of

theologians? No! He called four humble fishermen from the seaside of Galilee to assist in his work.



2000 years ago, Jesus said, *Come follow me* Peter, Andrew, James and John... and *I will make you fishers of people!* They made a dramatic response, a turning, a leaving behind and a setting out! These four fishermen took up the challenge. We know their story... how one denied him,

some fled when the going got tough, two demanded seats of honour in the Kingdom. They weren't perfect, but the Church grew from these first followers.

Jesus also calls me and you out of our comfort zones to be about his mission and ministry. No matter what our situation in life, we are called to minister. Remember, we are all baptized into the *Priestly, Prophetic and Kingly* ministry of Jesus Christ. A great week to reflect on how we can minister to others. It doesn't have to be extraordinary like leaving our family and home and jobs to follow Jesus. When Jesus says, *"Come follow me,"* we are commanded to be Gospel people... and spread His Good News at home, at school, at work, in our social gatherings. Whenever we are kind to others; or try to make peace; make amends; make others feel welcome... we are ministering. We spread the Gospel when we forgive others, help others, feed the hungry, clothe the naked. And the list goes on and on. What is one thing I can do this week to respond to Jesus' call? Many blessings!
