



BLIZZARD OF '77 40th Anniversary!

I am sure most of our parishioners remember the Blizzard of '77! I've heard so many stories. Ernie Rossi, author of *White Death*, wrote, *Lake Erie has a surface area of ten thousand square miles. This water surface had frozen by December 14th, 1976, an early freezing record. Here formed a desert of ice that was flatter than any prairie or desert of sand. It had snowed nearly every day since mid-December... with no warm days to*

northern New York State, resulting in what would be known as the Blizzard of '77. It was somewhat of a perfect storm, a unique storm, that resulted from a host of factors. The winds picked up the snow and dumped it on Niagara, which acted like a giant snow fence. With zero visibility for more than 24 hours and 60 below zero wind chills, both Niagara and northwestern New York were declared major disaster areas. It went on for four days, and high winds blew out people's windows, filled homes with ice, and buried cars, houses and individuals alike in 20- to 40-foot snowdrifts. Children were trapped in schools, motorists buried in their cars and residents spent days trapped in their own homes or those of strangers who took them in. In the end 29 people died in the storm, most from freezing in the cold temperatures. [But on a positive note, the birth rate in Niagara jumped 18 per cent, nine months after the storm.]
