The Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends:

Imagine, February begins tomorrow! The word *February* comes from the Latin, *februam- februa*, which means *to purify, to cleanse, to atone*. We will have wonderful opportunities for that this month, as Lent begins in just ten days. This is a sacred time to draw closer to our God, and to amend our ways. May we never forget that we have a God of Mercy!

If you're tired of winter, well here's Good News: next month Spring will arrive! And of course we will also celebrate Easter at the end of March! So hope abounds. Hang in there. Before long we'll be saying, "Spring is here, the grass is riz, I wonder where the birdies is!!!" And then we'll be hearing tweets and twirps and songs all around the gardens!

This Sunday's Gospel continues from last week. Jesus is in his hometown of *Nazareth*. His townsfolk spoke highly of him and were



amazed at the *gracious words* he spoke. Then things changed! "Is this not Joseph's son?", came from someone's lips! Jesus gets his back up. He challenged his people's ideas. They knew they were the chosen people! And they weren't open to anyone else being recipients of God's grace and salvation!

Jesus, in all his wisdom, give them the stories of the prophets Elijah and Elisha who went outside the Israelites to the Gentiles to work the wonders of God. He mentioned specifically a widow at Zarephath, and Naaman the Syrian, who were healed! Well, this upset the people, and they were filled with rage! What was Jesus doing? He was speaking a universal message from God, salvation for all. Jesus' kin were so upset they wanted to throw him over a cliff.

The crowd at Nazareth that day were angry because God didn't act as they preferred. They should be rejoicing at the kingdom of God breaking into their midst. I guess they fell into the old trap of trying to tell God how to act, telling God whom to bless and on what terms. It doesn't hurt to ask ourselves, **Do I limit God's activities to what I think God should do? Do I try to create God in my own image, rather than the other way around?** God does whatever God wants to do! God can be gracious to whomever God pleases. Do I really want a gracious God? Or a God whose love and grace is limited or trickled down to just a few? Maybe this week we can all take the sacred time to "Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow!" We sing that old hymn so well... so now we must follow the command to live it! God's blessings and mercy don't trickle, they flow! As a notorious U.S. politician frequently says, "Can I hear an Alleluia!" Have a blessed week!
