Dear Friends,

Monday, **July 16th is the Solemnity** of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. All our Masses this Sunday will be Votive Masses to Mary. The Readings will be used from the *Carmelite Lectionary*, so you will not find them in your Sunday Missal.

Mary is patroness of our Carmelite Order. We were founded on Mount Carmel in the Holy Land in the late 12th Century. Our first hermits built a chapel in the middle of their cells. This was the center of their lives where they gathered daily to celebrate Eucharist. This chapel was dedicated to *Our Lady of the Place.* The first Carmelites took Mary as their patroness, promising her their faithful service and expecting her protection and favour. They were proud to bear the title of *Brothers of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel.* For us Carmelites, Mary is a constant presence in our lives, guiding us and protecting us as we seek to follow Christ.

Many of you are familiar with the Brown Scapular. For many centuries this



has summed up the Carmelite's relationship with Mary. In 1251, Mary appeared to the Prior General of the Carmelite Order, Simon Stock, at Aylesford, England. In this apparition, Mary gave Simon what we call the *Brown Scapular*, a garment that has become the symbol of the bond between Our Lady

and the Carmelites. The scapular is a piece of cloth based on the traditional Carmelite friar's garb. Wearing the scapular is a sign of consecration to Mary, the Mother of God, and is a symbol showing that the person is putting on the virtues of Mary and is protected by her. Mary symbolizes for the Carmelite, everything that we hope for - to enter into an intimate relationship with Christ, being totally open to God's will and having our lives transformed by the Word of God.

Our Lady did not give the Scapular just to the Carmelites. She gave it for the whole Church so that all her sons and daughters could wear an outward sign of her love for them. As a "cloak" of grace and love, the Scapular represents the protection and security we find in Mary's love. The Scapular is not a magical charm to protect us, nor an automatic guarantee of salvation, or an excuse for not living up to the demands of the Christian life. The Scapular holds us to live as authentic Christians in line with the teaching of the Gospel, to receive the sacraments, and to profess our special devotion to the Mary.

May all of us seek to live in spiritual intimacy with Mary so that we can learn from her how to live as God's children. May God bless you and Mary keep you! Happy Feast Day!

July 20th - Feast of the Prophet Elijah- Father of Carmelites



The prophet Elijah appears in Scripture as a man of God who lived always in God's presence and fought zealously for the worship of the one true God. He defended God's law in the solemn contest on Mount Carmel, and afterwards was given on Mount Horeb an intimate experience of the living God. The inspiration that was found in him from the very beginnings of the Order so pervades its whole history that the prophet may

deservedly be called the founder of the Carmelite ideal... the Father of our Order.

15th Sunday- July 15, 2018

This Sunday's readings show us that God calls ordinary people to do extraordinary things! He called Amos... an arborist, to deliver His Word and truth to the people of Bethel. Amaziah, the leading priest, drove Amos away and told him to earn his bread elsewhere! But Amos was sent by God to prophesy to the people. This ordinary man became the vehicle of God's truth. In the Gospel, whom does Jesus call? Four fishermen, a despised tax collector, a political zealot, among others. There was nothing extraordinary about any of the twelve whom Jesus sent out to preach, to heal and to expel demons. They were ordinary people, given instructions by Jesus and the Word of God worked through them. God uses you and me also, to make His Presence real for others..., to continue his work. We are set aside for the Lord... called to holiness, so others can experience the wonder, the power and the beauty of God. God did this with Amos. God did this with the Apostles, God does this with his saints. He can and will do this with us. He makes us, the ordinary, extraordinary. Where can I spread Gospel love this week? Who needs to hear the Good News? What or whom needs to be healed? What demons need to be expelled from my life, from my family?

16th Sunday- July 22, 2018

In this Sunday's Gospel, the Apostles return from their mission. They gather around Jesus and tell him everything they had done! They were so excited. Then Jesus invites them to "come away to a deserted place... and rest!" But the crowds follow! Did Jesus turn them away? No!!! Jesus had compassion for the crowd, for they were like sheep without a shepherd. So he taught them many things. This Gospel has a strong message for us. We all need to get away every now and then to a deserted place! We all need private time, reflection time... God time!!! The challenge is to find a balance in our lives, between family time, work time, and quiet-personal time! And if God is a part of these three facets of our lives, we're in good shape! MAKE TIME FOR YOU... AND MAKE TIME FOR GOD!!! As the summer moves on... maybe we can find a little place for some rest and relaxation and reflection. And while we're reflecting, maybe ask ourselves, 'what gifts do I have that God can use to make someone else's life a little better?' Have a blessed week!
