

FROM THE PASTOR



July 16th is the **Solemnity of Our Lady of Mount Carmel**. Because we are Carmelites, all Masses this weekend will be votive Masses to Mary! Mary is the patroness of our Carmelite Order. As you know, we were founded on Mount Carmel in Israel in the late 12th Century. Our first hermits built a chapel in the middle of their cells. This was the centre of their lives where they gathered each day to celebrate Eucharist. They dedicated this little chapel to *Our Lady of the Place*. The first group of Carmelites took Mary as their patroness, promising her their faithful service and expecting her protection and favour. They were proud to

bear the title of *Brothers of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel.* For us Carmelites, Mary is a constant presence in our lives, guiding us and protecting us as we seek to follow Christ. We Carmelites have been serving in St. Patrick Parish since 1875! Yes, 142 years! Like Mary, may each of us do our best to live as authentic disciples! May we seek to live in spiritual intimacy with Mary so that we can learn from her how to live as God's children. May God bless you and Mary keep you! Happy Feast Day!

15th Sunday July 16th

This Sunday's Gospel (Matthew 13: 1-23), has Jesus speaking in parables! We have the Parable of the Sower and the Seed! Some of the seed is thrown on the pathway, where the birds eat it up, some on rocky ground where it had no deep roots, some among thorns where it was choked, and finally some were sown on good soil where it yielded an abundant harvest. The message? We are to be good soil! We are to hear the Word of God, and act on it, make it a way of life! Matthew goes on to explain the parable. The seed along the path is the person who hears God's word but doesn't understand it. The evil one devours what is scattered! The seed on the rocky soil is the person who does not have firm roots in his faith. The seed among the thorns is the person who wants to have faith but is preoccupied by the things of the world. Good soil is the one who hears the message and makes it his or her lifestyle. May God's word be the sure foundation of our lives!

16th Sunday July 23rd

Once again, Jesus speaks in parables! (Matthew 13: 24-43) Today we have the Parable of the Weeds and the Wheat! A farmer sows his seed, and wouldn't you know it, an enemy came during the night and sowed weeds among his wheat! Not nice! The farmer had to wait until harvest time to separate them. Why? Darnel is the weed referred to here. And darnel looks like wheat, even having a head similar to wheat. When the plant is young, it is impossible to distinguish it. It can only be separated at harvest time! Why would Jesus tell such a parable? I am sure the early Christians asked the same questions as me and you! Why does good and evil exist side by side? Why is there evil in the world! We turn on our televisions every day, and it's scary to see the things that happen in our world, even in our own country. God is more than aware of the evil in our world. As one scholar put it, "Evil is the price of freedom. If we didn't have the ability to choose between good and evil, we wouldn't be free. The choice of evil affects all people, but it is the price of having the ability to choose good." The farmer does not refuse to plant because he might find weeds among the wheat. He plants knowing that the result might not be perfect, but there will be wheat. It's up to us to put good out there, not to add to the evil, to plant good seeds, and to do our part to make the Kingdom of God more of a reality in our day! We are called to till the soil of the Lord, to bring forth good fruit. We can't allow evil to exist when we come upon it, particularly in ourselves. Happy weeding!

Feast of Elijah the Prophet!!!

July 20th is the *Feast of St. Elijah,* spiritual Father of the Carmelites! In the Old



Testament, Elijah is a solitary figure. On *Mount Carmel*, [where the Carmelite hermits first settled], Elijah challenged his people to choose one God for Israel, *Yahweh* or *Baa*l. According to 1Kings: 18, Elijah's sacrifice was consumed by fire, which proved to the people that Yahweh was the one true God. Undertaking God's work, Elijah started a journey through the desert, but he lost his focus and commitment. Sitting under a bush, he wished to die. But God prodded him to continue his journey to Mount Horeb. There Elijah

became aware of God, not with the usual signs of wind, fire and earthquake, but rather as a gentle breeze. Elijah was sent back to his people refreshed. From Elijah, Carmelites learn to become aware of the presence of God in the unexpected, and to be silent enough to hear God's whisper. We seek to allow the Word of God to shape our minds and our hearts so that the way we live and the things we do may be prophetic and therefore faithful to the memory of our father Elijah. There is no better way to honour the Great Prophet Elijah, than to be people of peace and justice, people faithful to God. May Elijah's zeal for the Lord consume our very being!
