Dear Friends,

It's hard to believe we are halfway through July! We still must take this pandemic one day at a time. Covid-19 is not over, so we still need to be very careful when we go into public places.

I wish to thank all of you for your patience during this crisis. Our parish office will remain closed to the public until September. All business will be conducted at the door. Please call ahead so we can have certificates or Mass cards prepared for you.

As you are aware, both myself and Fr. Stephen Bruzzesse have been taking all emergency calls to the hospital for the past 4 months. While our local hospitals will still be following the Pandemic schedule of Emergency calls only, we just learned that **ONE priest** from each parish will now be permitted to visit the hospital for "end of life care only", with a rotation schedule. Training is now available online for those priests. Again, this is for end of life, emergency calls only. God bless you all, and stay safe!

16th Sunday July 19th

Today we have the **Parable of the Weeds and the Wheat** (Matthew 13: 24-43). A farmer sows his seed, and wouldn't you know it, an enemy came during the night and sowed darnel weeds among his wheat! The farmer had to wait until harvest time to separate them. Why? Darnel looks like wheat, even having a head similar to wheat. When the plant is young, it is impossible to distinguish it. It can only be separated at harvest time! Why would Jesus tell such a parable? I am sure the early Christians asked the same questions as me and you! Why does good and evil exist side by side? Why is there evil in the world! It's scary to see the things that happen in our world, even in our own country. God is more than aware of the evil. As one scholar put it, "Evil is the price of freedom. If we didn't have the ability to choose between good and evil, we wouldn't be free. The choice of evil affects all people, but it is the price of having the ability to choose good." The farmer does not refuse to plant because he might find weeds among the wheat. He plants knowing that the result might not be perfect, but there will be wheat. It's up to us to put good out there, not to add to the evil; to plant good seeds, and to do our part to make the Kingdom of God more of a reality in our day! We are called to till the soil of the Lord, to bring forth good fruit. We can't allow evil to exist when we come upon it, particularly in ourselves. Happy weeding!

17th Sunday July 26th

Jesus uses three more parables to describe the Kingdom of heaven: a treasure hidden in a field; a merchant in search of fine pearls; and a net thrown into the sea. The kingdom is compared to the joy of the unexpected discovery of a treasure in a field. This causes a person to sell all and buy the field. The main point is the joy of discovery. The treasure of God's forgiveness, when found in the proclamation of Jesus, releases us to respond without counting the cost. The second parable of finding the pearl is different. A merchant has been searching for a precious pearl, and when he finds it, he sells all to buy it. The emphasis here is on the long and successful search. These two parables mirror our experience of discovering God's love and forgiveness perhaps unexpectedly, or perhaps after a long search. The third parable about the net with the good and bad fish, is really about the final judgment. This is a REMINDER that the treasure and costly pearl of God's Kingdom should evoke a response of grateful and faithful discipleship on our part.

That's the challenge! Our Christian life is defined by our *response to God* and to *our brothers and sisters*. Discovering God's kingdom is like stumbling across treasure or finding that one precious pearl. When we discover the Kingdom we receive the greatest possible treasure, the Lord himself. Treasure has a special connection to the heart, the place of desire and longing. The thing we most set our heart on *is* our highest treasure. May we never forget that as we go through life with its bumps and bruises, joys and sorrows, decisions and choices, roadblocks and challenges, ultimately, the Lord himself is the treasure we seek! Is the Lord the ultimate treasure and delight of my life?
