### July 24, 2022 17th Sunday

In today's Gospel (Luke 11:1-13), one of Jesus' disciples asks him to teach *us to pray*! And Jesus teaches them the *Our Father* Prayer! Christians have been praying this prayer ever since! We see in Luke's Gospel, how often Jesus goes off to pray alone. The disciples notice

this, and so they want to learn from the Master Himself! Prayer is what we are about, not just in Church, but as people committed to Jesus Christ. We need to nurture our dialogue, our conversation with him! That's called our prayer life. At Mass we pray the Lord's Supper as a community and we reverence the Lord within us in the Eucharist. We



are to pray throughout each day, whether morning prayer, grace before meals, devotional prayers like the Rosary, or night prayer. Our days are meant to be united to our God in prayer. Prayer truly expresses who we are, children of God. Then flowing from our prayer... are our Christian acts and good deeds... springing our prayers into action! We must **say** our prayers and also **do** our prayers!!!

### July 31, 2022 18th Sunday

Our Gospel this Sunday has Jesus telling the crowd, "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." This can be an eye-opener for all of us who hoard and gather. Jesus went on to tell a parable about a man who had so many crops that he had nowhere to store them. So he built bigger barns. And the man said to himself, "I have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry." But God called him a fool and told him his life will be demanded of him this very night. He warms those who store up treasures for themselves, but are not rich toward God. What are the priorities in my life? Family? Things? Job? Spiritual Life? Do things take precedence over people? Do activities take precedence over God? Do I hoard things while so many people lack for these very things? Am I generous toward those who struggle to survive... who struggle to put food on the table? Maybe we can open our hearts during the summer to Project Share, St. Vincent de Paul, or some local charity. As one saint said, "The only things we can take to heaven with us are the things we gave to the poor!" Did Jesus not say, "... give to the poor and you'll have treasure in heaven!" May you have a blessed August month, and may others benefit from our generosity!

### Feast of St. Titus Brandsma, O.Carm



July 27<sup>th</sup> is the Feast of our newly canonized Carmelite Saint, Titus Brandsma. Fr. Brandsma drafted the Dutch Catholic bishops' widely- circulated pastoral letter condemning anti-Semitism, which was read in Catholic parishes throughout the country. During WW II, he wrote

and spoke against the Nazis' anti-Jewish marriage laws and propaganda. In 1942, he was arrested after trying to persuade Dutch Catholic newspapers not to print Nazi propaganda (as was required by the Nazi occupiers). He was transferred to the concentration camp at Dachau. In July of that year, he was executed by lethal injection. He forgave the nurse who administered the injection and gave her a rosary. Though not religious at the time, <u>she later</u> became Catholic.
