From now until September we will be publishing our Parish Bulletin every other week. So today's Bulletin is for Sunday, June 23rd and June 30th

June 23, 2019 - Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ The Gospel we hear proclaimed today is the *Feeding of the Multitudes*. This Gospel really shows us the compassion of Jesus. It was late in the evening and all those people have had no food! The disciples wanted to send them away. They only had 5 loaves and 2 fish. But Jesus took what little they had, and "he looked up to heaven, blessed and broke them, and *gave* them to the disciples to set before the crowd!" And there was plenty for everyone. He took, blessed, broke and gave! These are all actions. These are the same actions we hear at the Last Supper, and also during the Emmaus Supper on Easter evening. And of course, at every celebration of the Eucharist! Maybe this week we can find some creative ways to connect the Eucharist to our daily lives. Being fed by the Body and Blood of Christ is not only our spiritual nourishment, food for the soul..., but it also calls for action! We must go forth and BE CHRIST for others. We each have gifts to share, no matter how insignificant they may seem to us. They might mean the world to someone else. Never underestimate what we can do by small acts of kindness - a kind word, a kind gesture, an act of charity, a friendly visit, a phone call. If we each do one kind action this week, in honour of Christ, what a difference we can make... at school, at work, in our families, in our neighbourhood. Have a good active week... receiving and giving many blessings!

June 30, 2019 - 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel is all about discipleship and radical commitment. When Jesus calls us to follow, he gives us the grace to put everything aside that prevents us from doing his will. Loyalty to Jesus requires sacrifice, letting go of my will for God's will. In today's Gospel a would-be disciple responded by saying, I must first go and bury my father! (take care of him until he dies.) Jesus didn't mean that we should refuse to care for others, especially our parents. His shocking response made clear that God must always be first in our lives. If we love God above all, then everything else will fall into its proper place. Jesus challenges his disciples and us, by saying that we must not look back (keep our hands to the plow) and keep our focus on the goal set for our lives, full happiness and union with God. Isn't that what we all desire? A plowman who looks back can cause his furrow to be crooked. Likewise, if we keep looking back to what we left behind, our path in following God will likely go off course and we'll miss what God has for us. Am I resolved to keep my eyes fixed on Jesus and to "stay the course" in following him to the end? That's the question! With Jesus, nothing should be wishy-washy! If we catch ourselves straddling fences, take that leap of faith, and come back onto his radical path. Have a good week, and a Happy Canada Day!
