The Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends!

As part of our diocesan mission *to set hearts on fire* with God's love we have embarked on a renewal program that focuses on helping to form dynamic parishes. A tool to help us begin this process is the **Parish Missional Health Survey**. It is not a 'report card' on the parish, or staff. It is a tool to provide the pastor and pastoral council with clear insight as to the relative strengths for each of the five systems for a missional parish: **worship**, **evangelization**, **discipleship**, **fellowship**, **and service**. This will help you to make strategic decisions for the good of the parish. The results of this survey will provide a baseline that can be used to measure improvements in missional health over time and to celebrate success! (*Bishop Bergie*)

In light of the Bishop's message, all parishes have been asked to choose **one** weekend, **either** April 26-27 **or** May 3-4 **or** May 10-11, to complete this survey. For St. Patrick Church, it will be next Sunday. We will have paper forms and pencils, or you can scan the QR Code and complete it that way. It has to be done during Mass.

Today we celebrate the Third Sunday of Easter! The Gospel for this Sunday is filled with many interesting details! This scene occurs sometime between the first Easter Day and Jesus' Ascension. Peter and his companions are back to their old jobs, fishing. Had they lost hope? This is the same place from where they were called to follow Jesus three years earlier.

After fishing all night they caught nothing. In the morning, Jesus appears and tells them to cast their nets to the right side of the boat. And they had a great haul of fish!!! 153 in total! It pays to listen to the Master! 153 fish? Interesting number! Supposedly, that was the number of nations known to exist at that time. St. Jerome claimed that at Jesus' time there were 153 known species of fish in the world! Whatever we make of it, it was a good catch. And Jesus prepares a meal over the charcoal fire! He knew they were hungry. And for more than food.

Another important thing in this Gospel is the dialogue between Jesus and Peter. Peter had denied Jesus three times. Now Jesus demands a triple affirmation from Peter as a negation of Peter's triple denial. Peter is now being called to show that he really loves Jesus. How? Care for my people, feed my lambs, tend my sheep! Aha! So must we. Jesus was raised from the dead so we can share in His life, and give this life to others.

Jesus calls out to me and you, "Do you love me?" We answer that, not by words alone, but by how we live our Christian lives, how we spread the Good News, how we reach out and feed his people! Others are depending on us. Yes, every single day. People in town, and from many corners of the world are looking to us. From Niagara Falls to Eastern Uganda! We have a mission to complete as members of the Body of Christ. We need to fulfill our function within the Body for the good of the world by proclaiming Jesus Christ with our lives. We have our Easter work cut out for us! In honour of the Risen Christ, may we each do one thing this week to reach out to a brother or sister in need!
