Welcome to November. This is *All Souls Month.* We honour our deceased family and parishioners with prayer throughout the entire month. Beginning this Sunday, we have a Nine-Day Novena of Masses for All Souls. We also have a *Book of Life* near the Sanctuary. We invite you to inscribe the names of your deceased loved ones in this Book. They will be remembered at all Masses, Rosaries and Prayers in our community throughout the month.

Dear Friends.

All our readings this Sunday are about LOVE. In the 1st Reading, as the people prepare to cross the Jordan, Moses told them to remain loyal to God and to love God with *all your heart and all your soul and all your might*. He basically tells them that their years of wandering are over and he assures them that their need for God will be no less in a land of plenty than it was in that barren desert. In the Gospel, the scribes ask Jesus a tough question, to test him. "Which commandment is the first of all?" And Jesus answers them that the TWO GREATEST COMMANDMENTS, are Love of God... and love of self and neighbour! This sums up all 613 precepts of the Old Testament Law.

Let's be honest: A God we cannot see **is so easy** to love! But what about our neighbour? And that includes every human person!!! Even those we don't like. That includes the lady in our group who constantly judges others; Or that crotchety neighbour; Or the man who sees everyone else going to hell except himself. Or the family member who ruins every family gathering; Or the one who hates to see others getting ahead in life; Or the group of teens hanging out on the street corner on skate boards yelling profanities; Or the homeless on the street asking for a loonie. The Gospel tells us to **love them all**. Aren't they also our neighbour? The bottom line is this; we show our love for God by how we love those around us. That's where the real challenge lies. As our great Carmelite Saint, St. John of the Cross said, "Put love where there's no love, and you'll find love." Maybe this week we can all examine how loving we really are.

You Asked!!!

Many people have asked me over the years, why do we have to pray for the dead? Or offer Masses for their souls? Is there still a Purgatory? I take you to the Catechism of our Church. Article 1030-34 tells us that all who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. This teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: "Therefore [Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin." From the beginning, the Church has honoured the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead: "Let us help and commemorate them. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice, why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation?" Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them.

The date for the opening of the Mass Book will be **Wednesday**, **November 6, 2024** at **9:00 am** for the **members of our parish**. Because of the limited number of announced Masses available, we ask that you limit your intentions to **4 per family**. You might consider having a general intention for the deceased members of your family. We also ask that you be flexible with your dates. We will be recording the Mass intentions in the **Office**, or you may place them in the Sunday collection. We will not be taking intentions over the telephone.
