Dear Friends,

Today is the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time! As the year progresses, the temperatures are getting cooler. We had a wonderful Thanksgiving Weekend. No more turkey until Christmas! It was so much fun introducing Fr. Joi to our Canadian Thanksgiving customs and traditions. I am sure many of you were happy to have family visit for the long weekend. It was a joy to have some 400 students and staff from St. Mary and St. Patrick Schools here for a special Thanksgiving Mass on Tuesday! The children shared so many things they were thankful for. These included their family, friends, their church, the shelter over their heads, the food and water, the animals. Children have a way of calling us all back to reality. They keep us humble... and they keep reminding us about the simplicity of life.

In today's Gospel James and John ask Jesus for seats of honour in the



Kingdom. They had been with Jesus for three years. Is this what they learned? I bet not!!! Imagine, this is shortly before Jesus' death, and that's all they can think about? Unbelievable. What can we learn from this?


