FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

In today's Gospel we have the last miracle of Jesus before he goes to Jerusalem to face his death. A blind man, Bartimaeus, is sitting by the roadside as Jesus and the crowds were passing by. This is the last



opportunity for this blind beggar to get Jesus' attention. He is desperate. So he calls out to Jesus, "Have mercy on me!" Jesus is probably teaching the crowd as he walks along. Bartimaeus calls out again, even calling Jesus "Son of David!" Wow, this man knows who Jesus is... and calls him by his right and deserved title!! This is better than the disciples

did! Who's really blind here? The disciples try to silence this man. And Jesus, who is always drawn to the poor, asks, "What do you want me to do for you?" "My teacher, let me see again." Jesus heals him from his blindness, and he immediately gets up and follows Jesus along the way.

Picture Jesus looking at us and asking the same question, "What do you want me to do for you? What would we answer? What do we really need or want from Jesus? The answer, of course, lies in the circumstances of our lives. Some of us suffer from injuries we have inflicted upon ourselves. Some of us suffer from the way we have been treated by others. Some of us suffer from ailments caused by no one, but resulting from our human condition. We have heart problems, or cancer, diabetes, kidney problems. We are caring for a relative with Alzheimer's, or journeying with a spouse or parent in the final stages of cancer. Or maybe struggling in our marriage or disunity in the family. Or grief. If we ever wonder where we can turn, know that Jesus, who is always passing by, is shouting to us, "Have faith in me."

Whatever we are going through, or whatever we need... may we be open to God's answer. It may not come in the way we want... but always remember **God's ways are not our ways**. Have a blessed week.
