Next weekend all parishes in our Diocese will be taking a second collection for Haiti. Needless to say, the Haitian people are in dire need. We can only imagine. The people have not yet recovered from the January 2010 earthquake! Before Hurricane Matthew, there still existed 105 Tent Cities!!!

It's now much worse. All was destroyed again. Haiti had already been grappling with a food shortage and a cholera crisis: 27,000 cases of the potentially deadly waterborne disease have been reported so far this year. It is predicted to triple in the coming weeks. Let's try to make a personal sacrifice for our brothers and sisters, and be as generous as we can. Also, our Parish will continue to collect items for Haiti for two more weeks (we just received word that they have an abundance of clothing). A list of needed items is posted at the doors of the church. The response thus far has been overwhelming. A second container will now be filled!!! God Bless!!!

Dear Friends in Christ:

No one likes to be lost! Whether lost while driving, lost in the crowd, lost in life! I'm sure we've all experienced being lost at times. Ask any new parent... or child, or new student... or new employee... or a person recently unemployed... or a widow or widower. It's not a comfortable feeling. It can be so painful and frightening.



This is what we see in today's Gospel. Jesus was entering Jericho, and there was a huge crowd. And Zacchaeus, who was "short in stature" (vertically challenged), really wanted to see Jesus! Now Zacchaeus was a tax-collector, a sinner, despised by society, lost! So he runs ahead and climbs a tree

to get a glimpse of Jesus. And he does! If it ended there, that would be ok! But Jesus was looking for him! Aha! And he calls out, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down; for I must stay at your house today!" Wow! What a story! And then a conversion takes place. Lost Zacchaeus is now found... he is saved! Jesus even says, "Today, salvation has come to this house!" Zacchaeus promises to give half of his possessions to the poor. He found his bearings in Jesus!

When we are separated from Jesus Christ, we are absolutely lost. We lose contact with the source of our life, even with the reason for our being. We end up making choices that compromise who we are. We fail to see the needs of others. Or could care less! No matter where we have been lost, or where we have strayed, Jesus is always seeking us out! And he wants us to climb that spiritual tree and receive what he has to offer, SALVATION !!! Jesus stands under our family tree too, under our marriage tree, and he says, "Mary, Billy, James, Lou, Betty, come down! I want to stay at your house today ... and forever." Let's accept his invitation this week, once and for all. No one wants to come down out of the tree, and remain lost!

All Souls Memorial Mass



This year our All Souls Memorial Mass will be celebrated in St. Patrick Church on Wednesday, November 2, 2016 at 7:00 PM. The names of our loved ones who died during the past year will be read aloud at this Mass. Bells will be chimed, and a candle will be lit after each name is read. Families who have lost a loved one during the past year, (whose funeral

was celebrated at St. Pats or by our priests at a funeral home) are encouraged to attend. All parishioners are invited! Our CWL will graciously host a reception in our parish hall after Mass.

You Asked!!!

Someone asked me last week, why do we have to pray for the dead? Or offer Masses for their souls? Is there still a Purgatory? I take you right to the Catechism of our Church. Article 1030-34 tells us that all who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. This teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: "Therefore [Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin." From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead: "Let us help and commemorate them. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice, why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation? Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them.

Next Sunday, November 6, our Confirmation Candidates will be attending the 9:30am Mass for a Parish Commitment Ceremony. This is part of their preparation process and we will promise to journey with them in prayer.
