The Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends:

Today is the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In our first reading, the Prophet Amos (8: 4-7) speaks up for the poor, just as any great prophet should do. He denounces the unjust business practices of his day. Merchants were getting rich off the backs of the poor, by tampering with the scales. This upsets God! Psalm 113 proclaims, "Praise the Lord who lifts up the needy!" God always lifts up the poor and downtrodden, and it displeases God when the poor are mistreated. In the Gospel Jesus says, "You cannot serve both God and wealth."

Hearing readings like this, gives us an opportunity to reflect on the things we have, our possessions, our treasures, our accumulations. We ask, "Did I acquire these things in an honest way? Did I trample on anyone to get ahead? Do I need everything I have, while many have nothing? Money, when it is not our master or a 'little god,' can do wonderful things. But how often have we heard, that "money is the root of all evil."

We must constantly examine our use of material possessions. In Luke's Gospel, (the Gospel of the poor) Jesus conveys a suspicion towards worldly wealth. Material things can trap us and divert our attention from what truly matters in life: *storing up treasures in heaven!* How often have we seen families divided over possessions and inheritances; marriages ruined and lives torn apart for the sake of the almighty dollar? So many people make gods out of money and things. Using our wealth to do good, is a **wisdom**. Using some of our resources to help the poor and hungry is a Gospel command. Our parish and community have many opportunities to offer a helping hand. May each of us find the strength and courage to make wise Gospel-use of our time, talents **and** treasures.

Martyrs of North America

On Friday, September 26th we will honour eight martyrs of North



America, six Jesuit priests and two lay assistants, who died in Canada and Upstate New York between 1642 and 1649. They were canonized in 1930. Their names are: Sts. Isaac Jogues, Jean de Brébeuf, Jean de Lalande, René Goupil, Anthony Daniel, Gabriel Lalemant, Charles Garnier, and Noel Chabanel. They are co-patrons of Canada! Faith and heroism planted belief in Jesus Christ deep

in our land. The Church in Canada and North America sprang from the blood of martyrs. God bless and protect all our missionaries, who put their lives at risk for the Gospel!

LIFE CHAIN

On Sunday, October 5th, Canadians will gather at 350+ locations to peacefully raise awareness about the truth of abortion during the 35th annual nation-wide Life Chain. One of these locations is Lundy's Lane at Prince Edward Ave, Highland Ave & Dorchester Road from 2:30-3:30 pm. Upon arrival, you will be greeted by the organizer and given signs to hold. Participants are encouraged to spread out along the sidewalk and spend time in quiet prayer. This is a unique, family-friendly event advocating for innocent pre-born children. As Christ reminds us in Matthew 25:40: "As you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you did it to me."

St. Vincent de Paul

Saturday, September 27, is the Feast Day of St. Vincent de Paul (1581–1660). He was a French priest who transformed from a self-seeking cleric into a tireless advocate for the poor. After enduring captivity by pirates, his path shifted, leading him to establish organizations like the *Congregation of the Mission* (Vincentians) and the *Daughters of Charity* to serve the needy. Known as the "Apostle of Charity," he founded charitable societies, initiated the first non-cloistered women's religious institute, promoted clergy reform, and played a significant role in social welfare, establishing what is now the global *Society of St. Vincent de Paul*.
