### St. Patrick Breakfast Program

Each year from September to June, our parish provides a breakfast for the needy children in our schools. With school opening this year during a Pandemic, we have received new guidelines. We cannot cook a hot breakfast anymore, and kids from all grades cannot come into parish hall together. We can only have pre-packaged breakfasts which must be dropped off at the school door by 8:30 AM. We cannot make any homemade muffins, toast etc., so this will affect how we prepare the breakfast this year. It will now be **Breakfast in a Bag**. In each bag we can put a juice Box, health bars; nutrigrain bars, individual cheese and crackers, fruit cups, Bear Paws, etc. There are many other pre-packaged options. If you are out and about shopping, please feel free to pick up any of those items and drop them to the parish office or to the church. We want no child going to school hungry. God bless you for whatever you can do to help feed the kids!

### 26th Sunday (September 27)

Jesus tells a parable to some political and religious leaders of his day! It's about two sons. The father asks both to go into the vineyard and work. The first says **NO**, but changes his mind and goes. The second says **YES**, but does not go! Both changed their minds! The **first son** represents the tax collectors, prostitutes, and other sinners. The **second son** represents the Jewish authorities. The first son was blatantly rude: "I will not go," but he had a change of heart. He came out all right. The second son knew what to say to his father. "I will certainly go, sir," but he blew it in the end. Jesus was poking fun at the scribes and Pharisees for their pride in having all the externals perfectly in order, while being blind to God's call in their lives. They did not heed John the Baptist! They had a chance to hear what John had to say about justice and righteousness, but they chose to remain fixated on external laws. Jesus clearly divides people into those **who act** and those **who don't**.

Having knowledge of Jesus' words and sayings, or knowing the Bible inside out, is one thing, but we have to build our lives **by actions** and **by love-put-into-**



**practice.** Good intentions are not enough. Promises are useless if they are not kept. Jesus uses the faith of the tax collectors and prostitutes who heard John's message and then changed their ways, as a model for his followers. Where am I in all this? Am I part of the **YES** crowd or the **NO** crowd? Do my actions match my words? Do I

walk the Christian talk? That's the challenge for us, to have our deeds match our words. Being Christian needs to be evident in the way we live. There must be no chasm between our words, actions, and faith. I know we can all try harder. If we do **mess up**, or stray off the path, our God of second chances gently invites us back, ready to forgive us and love us!

### 27th Sunday (October 4th)

Jesus tells another parable to the Chief priests and the elders. This parable is about a Vineyard which was leased to tenants. The owner went to another country. When he returned, he was not too pleased by what he found. The tenants had beaten and killed the workers, and even the owner's son. And Jesus' response to this parable, directed to the leaders? ***The kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that produces the fruits of the kingdom.*** "That's our role, to produce the fruits of the kingdom of God!"

In the final harvest of our lives, when we meet our Maker, to give an account of ourselves, what will God find in me? Would he find me doing what I am called to do? What would he find in my heart? **In my home?** How would he find me treating my children? My spouse? My parents? My family? Where would he find me on Sunday mornings? Would he be pleased with my relationships? My social life? My attitude? What would he think of the way I treat others? How I treat my neighbor? The elderly? The poor? The homeless? The stranger? Our call is to keep cleaning house. Throw out what doesn't belong in our Christian lives, what doesn't lead to God. Then when the day of the Lord comes, the day of the great harvest, we will be ready and waiting. **Knowing** that I have done my best. Gave it my best shot. That's all God asks!

### Update on Stolen Tabernacle from Cathedral

Happily, the Tabernacle, Ciborium and Luna that were stolen from our Cathedral last week have been recovered. They were found in a river not far from the church. Some repairs will have to be done to the Tabernacle doors. It is believed and hoped that the Blessed Sacrament has dissolved in the water. We pray for the perpetrators.



### Blessing of Animals

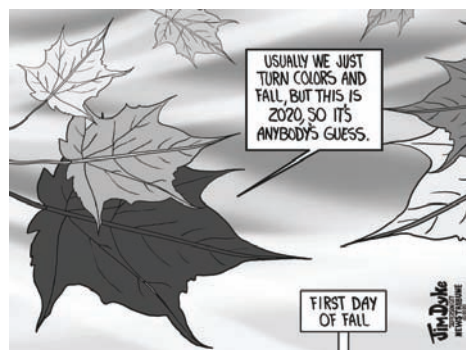

### October, Month of the Holy Rosary

The month of October is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. The liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7th. It was instituted to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful. The feast was introduced by Pope St. Pius V (1504-1572) in the year 1571 to commemorate the miraculous victory of the Christian forces in the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. The pope attributed more to the "arms" of the Rosary than the power of cannons and the valor of the soldiers who fought there. Legend tells us that the Rosary as a form of prayer, was given to St. Dominic (1170-1221) by Mary, the Mother of Our Lord, who entrusted it to him as an aid in the conflicts with the Albigensians (.13th Cent. heretics). The Dominican pope, St. Pius V, did much to further the spread of the Rosary and it thereafter became one of the most popular devotions in the Church.

### Feast of St. Therese, The Little Flower



October 1st is the Feast of our great Carmelite Saint, *St. Therese of Lisieux*, Patroness of the Missions! She lived a short 24 years from 1873-1897, in Alencon and Lisieux, France. She has become the most popular saint of all times. Her autobiography, *The Story of a Soul*, has been translated into over 50 languages! St. Therese taught us the "Little Way!" And that is finding God in the ordinary everyday activities of life! When Pope John Paul II declared her Doctor of the Church in 1997, he called her "a young Carmelite who was filled with the love of

God, who offered herself completely to his love, and who knew how to practice love of neighbour in the ordinary things of daily life." That is certainly a call to all of us! Therese wrote, "Miss no single opportunity of making some small sacrifice, here by a smiling look, there by a kindly word: always doing the smallest right and doing it all for love!" She also said, "You know well enough that Our Lord does not look so much at the greatness of our actions, nor even at their difficulty, but at the love at which we do them."

#### First Communion
