

Today is Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week - The action of this week moves from the triumph of the palm procession through the agony and death of the Lord to his

glorious Resurrection from the dead. During Holy Week, the People of God take time to reflect and pray about what Jesus has done for us in his love. We become more aware of the many ways in which we continue to live and experience the dying and rising of Jesus in our daily lives.

Passion Sunday Palms. The blessing of palm branches and the procession remind us of Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem. We praise Christ our king. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Jesus comes to save us and the world by the Paschal Mystery. His Death and Resurrection accomplishes our salvation. Quickly the mood of the celebration change. The solemn reading of the Passion account from Matthew, Mark or Luke reminds us of the purpose of Jesus' entrance into the Holy City. We have begun to follow him on the way of the Cross, along the road that leads us to Calvary and to Easter. We place palms in our homes to show reverence for Jesus our leader. We are his followers in suffering as in glory.

April Heroes of Hope During the month of April in this Jubilee Year, we are asked to pray for those who minister to the sick.

Lord God, by the grace of our baptism, you have given us new life in Christ and called us to serve as pilgrims of hope.

We praise you for the healing gifts you give to our healthcare providers; our doctors, nurses, personal support workers, pastoral care ministers and family members who accompany the sick with compassion.

Gospel Reflection: Palm Sunday - Jesus appears to be in total command of events at the Passover meal as he hands over the kingdom to his disciples. He welcomes them to the Passover meal announcing that this will be his last until the Kingdom of God is fulfilled.

The disciples show little understanding of this kingdom that Jesus often announces. Jesus initiates a conversation with Simon and predicts his denial. Jesus then instructs his disciples to prepare themselves for the events that will follow. His words reveal an awareness of the challenges that all of them will face in the days ahead. As the disciples and Jesus enter the Mount of Olives, Jesus indicates the importance of the disciples' time in prayer, telling them that through prayer they will be able to face the challenges ahead.

As he prays, Jesus is tested. In the garden, an angel is sent to strengthen him and to prepare him for the events ahead. After this moment, Jesus is again in charge of the events and circumstances.

When Luke describes the Way of the Cross and Jesus' crucifixion, he calls to our attention many events that are not reported in the other Gospels. Throughout his Gospel, Luke has paid heed to the women who accompanied Jesus. Now, on the road to Calvary, Jesus speaks to the women who walk with him. Only Luke reports Jesus' words of forgiveness spoken from the cross. And only Luke reports the dialogue between Jesus and the good thief. Finally, in contrast with the Gospels of Mark and Matthew, Luke reports no words of abandonment spoken by Jesus on the cross. Instead, Jesus, in full command until his death, commends his spirit to his Father and takes his final breath. From the Loyola Press – Sunday Connection


