


Information about the Sacraments -

We are pleased to announce that registration will open on Monday June 2 through our parish website for the Sacraments of First Holy Communion and Confirmation for the 2025-2026 School Year.



The Sacraments of First Holy Communion and First Reconciliation are open to children who will be in Grade 2 or above during the 2025-2026 school year. To register, your child must be baptized in the Catholic faith, and a copy of their Baptism certificate must accompany your registration. Dates and more details will be given out after the close of registration. Registration will close Oct 15, 2025.

If your child has not been baptized, or was baptized in another Christian denomination and you would like them to receive First Holy Communion, please reach out to our parish office no later than Friday August 29, 2025. Those who have not yet been Baptized and will be in Grade 3 or above in the Fall of 2025 will need to enroll in our RCIC Program (see more below).



The Sacrament of Confirmation is for students who will be in Grade 7 or above during the 2025 -2026 school year, and who have already received the Sacraments of First Holy Communion and First Reconciliation. A copy of your child's Baptism certificate must accompany your registration.

Confirmation will take place on Saturday, November 22, 2025. More information will

be provided after the close of registration. Registration will close Oct 15, 2025.



Gospel Reflection: The Ascension of the Lord -

when Jesus was taken to heaven on the 40th day after Easter. There are similarities in the reports of Jesus' Ascension found in the Synoptic Gospels—Mark, Matthew, and Luke. In each account, Jesus assigns his disciples the task of proclaiming the Gospel to the entire world. There are also notable distinctions. In the Gospels of Mark and Matthew, the disciples are sent by Jesus to baptize as well as to preach. In Luke's Gospel, however, this commission to baptize is absent. Instead, Jesus directs the disciples to return to Jerusalem to await the fulfillment of his promise to send them the Holy Spirit. Curiously, only Mark and Luke report Jesus' Ascension into heaven. Matthew's Gospel concludes with Jesus' promise to remain with his disciples forever.

Today is our liturgical celebration of the Ascension of the Lord,

Only the Gospel of Mark notes that Jesus ascended to sit at the right hand of God. In noting this, Mark teaches that Jesus' Ascension affirms the glory Jesus received from God after his death and Resurrection.

Those who believe in Jesus will be empowered to do what Jesus himself has done. Already in Mark's Gospel, during his ministry, Jesus sent his disciples out to preach, to heal, and to drive out unclean spirits. Now, they are sent again to do these things and more. From his place with God in heaven, Jesus helped his disciples, and he continues to help us as we try to live as his followers. *Taken from Loyola Press*


