

Sat Jun 21 is the Feast Day of St. Aloysius St. Aloysius Gonzaga – Patron of Youth

Born into a noble Italian family in 1568, Aloysius (Latin for Louis) was the eldest of seven children. Trained as a soldier from age 4, he later fell ill and began to devote himself to prayer. At just 9, he took a private vow of chastity and by 12 felt called to religious life. Despite opposition from his father, Aloysius joined the Jesuits at 17, giving up his inheritance. He took vows at 19 and became a deacon at 20.

During the plague of 1591, Aloysius cared for the sick in a Jesuit hospital, eventually contracting the disease himself. He died shortly after his 23rd birthday.

Canonized in 1726, St. Aloysius is the patron saint of youth, students, Jesuit novices, and those suffering from disease. He remains an inspiration to the young people of our parish.



**Gospel Reflection: The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity** - Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity—one God in three persons.

The verses of today's Gospel come near the end of Jesus' long discourse at the Last Supper. In the early part of this discourse, as we saw last week on Pentecost, Jesus offers assurances to the disciples. Even though he must leave the disciples, he tells them that they will have a future because of the help he will send them in the Holy Spirit. In this section he focuses more on the shape of the future, which will include Jesus' victory over the world that they will share in. The disciples of Jesus cannot know the future. They can only know that, whatever shape the future takes, they will not have to face it alone. They have the Spirit of Truth, who will continue to provide the teaching of Jesus in the future.

Reading this passage on Trinity Sunday reinforces our understanding of the unity shared by the members of the Trinity. Although the idea of one God in three persons remains a mystery, we have the assurance that, as Jesus and the Father share all, Jesus and the Spirit share all. *Taken from Loyola Press*
