

Gospel Reflection: Pentecost Sunday -

The season of Easter concludes with today's celebration, the feast of Pentecost. We previously heard today's Gospel on the second Sunday of Easter. At that time, we also heard the passage that follows, which describes Jesus' appearance to Thomas. In



that context, we were led to reflect on belief and disbelief.

In the context of the feast of Pentecost, this reading reminds us about the integral connection between the gifts of peace and forgiveness and the action of the Holy Spirit. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

This Gospel reminds us that the Church is called to be a reconciling presence in the world. This reconciling presence of Christ is celebrated in the Church's sacramental life. The presence is also to be a way of life for Christians. In situations of conflict, we are to be agents of peace and harmony among people. *Taken from Loyola Press*
