

Lent begins this week on Ash Wednesday, March 5

Join us for Mass on Ash Wednesday at 8:30am or 7:00pm.

We observe Ash Wednesday and the Fridays during Lent as days of special penance. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the two

obligatory days of fasting and abstinence in the Catholic Church. We are also instructed to abstain from eating meat each Friday during Lent.

Why fast?

It is a sign of repentance and shows our spiritual hunger for Christ who fasted for 40 days before his death and Resurrection.

What else can we do during Lent to help deepen our relationship with Christ?

- Penance: Besides abstaining from meat, abstain from some other form of food, drink or entertainment.
- Prayer: Attend Mass regularly and try and go to at least one extra Mass during Lent. Pray with your family and spend extra time in personal prayer. Join the Stations of the Cross with the Community.
- Good works: Do good to others by visiting the sick or aged, help those in need, or contribute your time or money to charity.

Friday Evening Mass During Lent - Starting this Fri Mar 7, and every Friday during Lent, join us for an additional Friday evening Mass at 6pm followed by Stations of the Cross. We will not be having a Friday evening Mass on Good Friday.

First Friday - This Friday March 7 is also the First Friday of the month. Join us after the 8:30am Mass for Adoration

Gospel Reflection: Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time -

The third and final section of Luke's Sermon on the Plain begins: *And he told them a parable*. There are actually four parables, all about how to be a good disciple.

The blind cannot lead the blind. And a disciple cannot be a good disciple unless he or she has learned from the teacher. Everyone who is fully trained is like the teacher who knows how to cure the blind. Before you can be a good disciple and teach others you must take care of yourself. Do not try to take a speck out of your brother's eye until you have taken the board out of your own. Finally, only when you have purified yourself can you produce the good works that the teacher requires. Discipleship asks us to produce good deeds. But to produce them requires the integrity and purity of heart found in the teacher. When people see your good deeds they will know that this is because you have a good heart.

The final parable, which we do not read today, is about building on the solid foundation of rock and not on sand. This is the only way to face the difficulties a disciple will encounter and survive. From Loyola Press – Sunday Connection


