<u>**PARISH RECORDS</u>** • Our parish records are very important and we try to keep them as up to date as possible. Please advise the office if you change your address or telephone number.</u>

<u>MINISTRY TO PARISH SCHOOLS</u> • The staff visit St. Nicholas and Sir Edgar Bauer on a regular basis. Eucharist and Reconciliation are celebrated with each school during the year and the staff is available for classroom visits and other special celebrations. We also celebrate the sacraments and make pastoral visits to St. David's high school as needed.

MINISTRY TO UNIVERSITY & COLLEGE STUDENTS • St. Michael's Parish welcomes students to participate in the liturgical and pastoral life of the parish. During the academic year we celebrate a 7pm Sunday Mass for students. The St. John Paul II Student Centre (jp2waterloo.ca) offers programing throughout the week, and Campus Ministry at St. Jerome's University provides pastoral care and programming for students on the University of Waterloo campus (sju.ca).

<u>BAPTISM</u> • For more information about preparation and dates please visit our website or contact the parish office.

<u>MARRIAGE</u> • Please meet with the priest or deacon before making any other arrangements. Twelve (12) months notice is normally required so that proper preparation can take place.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND • Trained volunteers assist in the pastoral care of those who are sick or confined, whether at home, at retirement residences, long term care facilities or in hospitals. Anointing of the Sick is celebrated at Columbia Forest Long Term Care, The Village at University Gates, The Court at Laurelwood and Clair Hills Retirement Community twice a year. Parishioners can request the Anointing of the Sick at any time by appointment in their home or in the church.

PASTORAL CARE TO THOSE WHO ARE IN HOSPITAL • Privacy of information laws prohibit the parish from obtaining information about parishioners in hospital. A family member is asked to contact the parish office whenever a parishioner is in hospital and requests a pastoral visit.

PARISH OUTREACH • St. Michael's Parish assists those in need through the St. Vincent De Paul Society. For emergency food help call 519-747-1090.

<u>MUSIC IN THE LITURGY</u> • Music plays an integral role in the liturgical life of the parish. Parishioners are invited to sing with the traditional choir (9:00 a.m.) or the contemporary choir (11:00 a.m.) on Sunday morning.

A Word of Welcome to many visitors who are with us this weekend for the celebration of Palm Sunday. For some, you are visiting our community; for others, you may be searching for a new spiritual home. Please know that we are delighted that you are with us, and know that you are always welcome.

This coming week truly is a Holy Week. During the coming days, we will celebrate the central mysteries of our Faith. I invite you to share these days with friends, neighbours and most of all your fellow parishioners as we pray together.

On **Holy Thursday** at 7:30pm our celebration focusses on service and the gift of Eucharist. We also have time after to spend quiet time in prayer in our Kateri Room with Our Lord to prepare.

On **Good Friday**, our service at Noon is designed especially for families with young children, please make room for these young families at this Mass. At 3:00pm, there is a solemn celebration open to all. And at 11:00am and 7:00pm, we will have the presentation of a **Passion Play**. This moving drama by our high schoolers will not only leave a meaningful impression, but it will make a significant impact upon you - please come be a part of this. You are reminded that Good Friday is a Day of Fast and Abstinence from Meat.

On **Holy Saturday**, the celebration of the Blessing of Easter Food takes place at 10:00am. Then, at the Solemn Easter Vigil beginning at 8:00pm, we will welcome *twelve adults* as full members of the Catholic Church. It is a beautiful liturgy and one which is so worthy of your presence and participation.

Easter Sunday morning our praises ring. Consider starting the day early with the 7:30am. Mass. This provides extra space for visitors at our later Masses. Additional seating room will also be available in our Kateri Room at 9:00am and 11:00am.

For all of our celebrations during Holy Week, a reminder that additional off-site parking is available. Please consider parking there - making room for visitors and first time guests who may not know they can.

BLESSING OF EASTER FOOD

It is a long-standing tradition of some Catholic families to have a basket of food blessed on *Holy Saturday at 10:00am*.

The foods blessed all have symbolic meanings and are a special part of that family's culinary celebration of Christ's passion, death, and Resurrection. Some of the different foods and symbolisms are: White, hard-boiled eggs - Christ's tomb: Ham - Christ's body; White bread - Life Eternal; Horseradish roots - the nails of the cross; Kielbasa - the ropes that bound Jesus; Oranges - the vinegar-soaked sponge offered to Jesus; Five red, decorated eggs - Jesus' five wounds; One white decorated egg - Jesus' glorious Resurrection; Salt, pepper, butter, eggs, cheese and wine are often included with the traditional foods. The foods are often covered with a white linen cloth representing the shroud in which Jesus was wrapped. The blessed food is eaten in a family breakfast after they attend Easter Mass together. Consider as a family preparing an Easter Basket this year.
