Sunday's Gospel Reflection (Jn 2.1-12)



At the time of Jesus, many have considered God as strict legislator who rewards for obeying commandments and punishes for not doing so. By changing the water for Jewish purification into "choice wine" Jesus proclaims a replacement of religion of duty, where everything is paid according to the merits, into religion where everything is based on grace and unconditional forgiveness.

It is not a coincidence that the changing of the water into wine happens in the context of a wedding. This fact reveals God's desire for a relationship with each of us based on unmerited love, the same love that unites the bridegroom and the bride.

Refugee Program Update: Great news! Our Iraqi refugee will soon be here - Ghadeer arrives in Canada on January 19th. Please keep her in your prayers as finally she begins the next chapter of her life, reunited with her family in Kitchener. All of the funds for her sponsorship are already in trust and because she will be living with her parents, there is no need for any in-kind donations. The Syrian family continues to do well. All are in school, one of the teenagers already has a parttime job, they have a wonderful spirit and are adjusting to the cold. No news yet regarding the Rohingya family in India. A sponsorship application has been submitted for another refugee - a young Syrian man currently in Iraq whose situation is very precarious. The refugees that St. Michael's sponsors are just a few of the 26.4 million refugees worldwide.

St Michael Harambee Child Sponsorship

Program: Some donations received late in December brought the total donations to \$85,099.17 for 2021. Of this amount, \$84,299.17 from 118 sponsors supports 113 students in various schools - local elementary and secondary, boarding schools for elementary and secondary, universities, trade schools and technical schools. All of the monies have been sent to the Mission Co-operative Office at the Diocese of Hamilton. From there, the monies are forwarded to the School Sisters of Notre Dame, International Development Office, in the US. These monies are then accessed by the Notre Dame Children Outreach in Nyalieng'a Kenya when needed. There is some loss of funds because of currency exchange but there are no administrative charges, a reflection of the importance of this program to all the partners involved. Thank you once again to all the sponsors. Your donations provide needy children with education, health care, food security, social and emotional support and hope for a better future. Asante!
