Papal Visits to Canada:

Throughout the centuries, Popes have travelled outside Rome and even beyond Italy ... Blessed **Paul VI** (1963-1978) was the first Pope to leave Europe and the first to travel by airplane. Pope Saint **John Paul II** (1978-2005) travelled considerably – even more than any of his predecessors combined ...

What is the motivation behind such trips? ... In the mind of the Church, they are connected to the proclamation of the Gospel. Indeed, in the official language of the Church, such trips are called "*apostolic voyages*" in order to reflect their relation to the Pope who is ... the Vicar of Christ on earth. In its history so far, Canada has received three Apostolic Visits, each made by Pope Saint John Paul II, in 1984, 1987, and 2002 (*https://www.cccb.ca*).

Pope Francis – catechesis on the elderly:

"I wish to emphasize that the tenderness of the elderly and grandparents shows us the tenderness of God. Watch how a grandfather or a grandmother look at their grandchildren, how they embrace their grandchildren – that tenderness, free of any human distress, that has conquered the trials of life and is able to give love freely, the loving nearness of one person to others. This is what God is like, He knows how to embrace. And old age helps us understand this aspect of God who is tenderness. ...

When we think of old age like this, we can say – why has this throw-away culture decided to throw out the elderly, considering them useless? The elderly are the messengers of the future, the elderly are the messengers of tenderness, the elderly are the messengers of the wisdom of lived experience.
