# From the Pastor's Desk:

The Holy Season of Easter prompts us to reflect on the fruits of Christ's resurrection. Take some time each day to meditate on the resurrection of Jesus. There are many focus points that we could take in our Easter reflections. We could look at what this event meant for God, taking the time to speak to each person of the Holy Trinity:

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We could reflect on what the Resurrection meant for the Blessed Virgin Mary, who was

so closely united to her Son and His mission. Perhaps our reflections can centre on the effect that the resurrection of Jesus had on the apostles and disciples of Jesus, those who have been with Him all along throughout His active ministry, His passion, and His resurrection. These are different entrance points into the meditation prayer about Easter, about Resurrection of Jesus. Spend each day reflecting (thinking) about the Easter message from different vantage points.

I would like to offer a reflection about the Resurrection of Jesus from the perspective of our own lives. Here are the questions worth considering: "How does the Easter message of Jesus affect my life? Does it affect my life? How does the Resurrection of Jesus guide my way of seeing God, people around me, and myself? How is the Resurrection of Jesus part of the Good News which I am invited to live and share?

As I reflect on the events following Christ's resurrection I keep thinking about the words of the risen Jesus to his disciples: "Peace be with you". In the midst of their confusion, fear, and discomfort Jesus wants his disciples to receive the gift of peace. And since the gift of peace is offered to the disciples after the resurrection of their Lord, it should follow that it must be closely connected to the Easter experience. We all want peace, and yet we often find our hearts completely filled with the worries of this world, and leaving no room for God's gift of peace. In order to receive God's gifts into our hearts, including the gift of peace, it would make sense that we must first make some room in our hearts. If our minds and hearts are packed tightly with the worries of this world, we will have no room left for God's gift of peace. So, the first step in receiving "peace" is to make room. We must examine our daily activities and weigh how much of our time and mental energy is spent on the "things of this world", vs the amount of time spent on the "things of heaven". When we consume different forms of media, for example, how much of our consumption is on worldly things (news, secular programs, etc.) and how much on "heavenly things" (prayer, religious programs, etc.) At minimum we should be at least 50% focused on heavenly things. It is also important to make sure that we leave part of our mind and heart open and free. Every minute of our day should not be filled with things to do, things to listen, media to consume. God cannot come into our lives with his gifts unless we leave some room for Him. Taking some time for silent prayer, quiet sitting, reflective walking, driving without the radio being on, can open part of our mind and heart to the promptings of the Holy Spirit and the gift of peace. Jesus offers his "peace" to the apostles after his resurrection. This means that an essential element of God's Good News is tied closely to the resurrection of Jesus.

As we examine Christs' Easter encounters with the disciples, we also see a connection between the gift of "peace" and the gift of "mercy". Once Jesus rose from the dead he offered us the gift of forgiveness. We see the message of mercy as an essential message of the early Church after the resurrection. When St. Peter preaches the Good News he says: "God exalted Jesus at his right hand as Leader and Saviour that he might give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins" (Acts5:30). When we share

the Good News of Jesus with others it is the message of forgiveness that we should be sharing. To know that we can be forgiven, that we can be restored, and our life can be filled with God's peace through Jesus; That is the most important message that our friends, neighbours, children, need to hear. Christ has risen, and He is offering us the gift of His "peace". **Fr. Wojtek Kuzma**




