From the Pastor's Desk: Christmas is almost here! Are you ready? The time of preparation is

almost over, but there are still a few days left. Unlike Lent which lasts 7 weeks. I find the 4 weeks of Advent tend to go by very quickly, and before we know it Christmas is here. There is much to do before Christmas, especially if family and friends are coming to visit. I know that this year will be different with less people traveling. Perhaps our households will not be as numerous as per normal, perhaps not as many gifts will be exchanged. Regardless of the limitations placed upon us, I still believe that it is essential that we celebrate Christmas with all our might, even if there are less people at home. Perhaps during these difficulties we can look at the reasons why Christmas should not and cannot be cancelled. The Christian focus of Christmas is on God and not on all the other traditions that have developed over the centuries. During Christmas celebrations we are to give thanks to God for His love for us, His humility in wanting to be one of us, and His generosity in wanting us to be one with Him. During this time of uncertainty and danger we must be reminded of the essence of our faith, the primary place of God in our lives, and the unchanging truth of our Catholic Church. One of the best ways to enter into the celebrations of Christmas is to unite ourselves with God and His Church in a renewed way. Here is how the Catholic Church recommends we do that. First, celebrate the sacrament of Confession. It has been part of our tradition that we prepare our souls for the celebrations of these major feasts by going to Confession. We do this at least during Advent and Lent. It is still not too late. Priests will be at the Office from 9am-5pm on Tuesday and Wednesday of this week ready to hear Confessions. Come by any time and ask to see a priest. Second, spend time in prayer every day, in the morning and in the evening, quietly sitting with the Lord and seeking greater closeness with Him. You can join us for the Live Streamed rosary at 9pm, or you can come to our weekday Masses and pray with us. The key is to intensify your prayer life during these days of preparation. And third, surround yourself with Christmas music, books, and movies, especially those that have a religious theme. Art has a way of inspiring us and helps us to experience life by engaging our souls. I pray that these final days of Advent will be spent in preparing our souls for the coming of Jesus into our homes and our souls. Fr. Wojtek Kuzma
