





Will They Know?

a woman's perspective

...And they'll know we are Christians, by our love, by our love, yes they'll know we are Christians by our love (Peter Scholtes). Would they know you are Christian by your love? I often ask myself that question. I hope the answer is yes...not yes, sometimes...when I'm not hungry, tired, or driving my car, but yes - always. That's a tall order, but it's something that should always be at the forefront of our minds, always present in our thoughts. By the things I do and say; by the way I treat others; through gestures, expressions, the tone of my voice, would they know? Can they tell? Is it obvious, without being forced, fake or over the

top? It's not just how I appear outwardly. I may go to Mass regularly, receive the sacraments faithfully, but do I love? St. Paul says: If I speak in the tongues of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. 1 Cor. 13.1-3

Like I said, it's a tall order, but it is what we are called to do, to live, to be. How can we live this love we are called to? Well, for starters, let's look at the world, and each individual in it, positively. Negativity is an unhealthy practice. If those around us are negative, constantly grumbling, we could leave them to it and find more positive people with whom to associate...or, we could try to lift them up and out of their grumbling. Point out those things they could be happy about, try to steer them away from all that's wrong with the world, with their lives. Another way to show love is to show gratitude, daily. If our attitude is positive, gratitude will come very easily to us. If our attitude is positive, we will enhance the lives of those around us and they may go on to do the same for others - like dropping a pebble in a pond, the ripple effect will go on and on and on, and then, yes, 'See how they love one another,' people will say.

Over the years, in a file on my computer, I have been compiling a list of quotes that hit me when I first read them. A Seminarian's Thoughts:

In the summer of 2005, I was eighteen years old and wondering what to do with my life now that I was out of the seminary. My parents had told me about a Catholic liberal arts university in Barry's Bay, Ontario called Our Lady Seat of Wisdom Academy. It was a small little school, with only about fifty students, having just begun in 2000. But it was a thriving and growing Catholic community, a little oasis of sanity in a crazy world. Nestled in cottage country, Barry's Bay was the next town over from Combermere, where Madonna House is located. Madonna House is a wellknown retreat house where many people gather to get away from society and draw closer to God.

So I applied to the Academy, as we called it, and began attending there that September. Once again, God had provided me a path forward that three months previously I could not have imagined taking. One of the first days I was there in Barry's Bay, a group of us decided to go swimming down at the lake. After everyone left and headed back up to the campus, I stayed in the water. The sun was setting, the sky was blue and clear. I remember an overwhelming feeling of gratitude washing over me. That was the moment when I really felt free, so to speak. No one was watching me at that moment. No one was telling me it's time to go, time to move on to the next activity. It may seem strange, but even the freedom to walk into a store and buy something was a novelty I was not used to. I thanked God for having led me to that moment. I was where I should be. What lay in store in the future, though, was beyond my guess.





The Diocese of Hamilton is conducting the One Heart,



One Soul Campaign to raise money for every parish in the Diocese and for shared ministries. Answers to a set of Frequently Asked Questions appear in parish

bulletins regularly.

Are Parishes in a position to take on needed projects?

This, of course, varies from Parish to Parish, but in general most Parishes are not in a strong position to take on major projects (those of \$250,000 or more), and many projects have been delayed because of a lack of funding. One of the main reasons for the diocesan capital campaign is to assist Parishes big and small to gain more solid footing for the future - whether that's by completing an overdue project, retiring debt, building a contingency fund or looking ahead with a new ministry or new staff.

What about Parish debt and Parish reserves - in general, where do things stand?

The majority of the Diocese's Parishes can meet their operating budget and can take on small capital projects. Only a few, however, have substantial savings. Some have incurred debt, and the Diocese assists where it can with donations and loans, some of which are interest-free, to Parishes

Will the Parishes or the Diocese take on debt because of this campaign?

It's possible for the right project and the right reasons, but that is to be determined by the Diocese and Parishes as the campaign planning moves forward.


