

From the Pastor's Desk:

Broken and Joyful

St. Francis often encouraged his disciples to be joyful, because there is no other way to be for a Christian. One day St. Francis noticed that Brother Leo was sad. He asked him: "Leo, do you know what it means to be pure of heart?" "Of course" answered Brother Leo, "it means to have no sins to reproach myself for. But I always have something to reproach myself for". St. Francis answered: "Leo, listen carefully to me. Don't be so preoccupied with the purity of your own heart. Turn and look at Jesus. Admire him. Rejoice that he is what he is, your Brother, your Friend, your Lord and Saviour. That, little brother, is what it means to be pure of heart. And once you've turned to Jesus, don't turn back and look at yourself. Don't wonder where you stand with him. The sadness of not being perfect, the discovery that you are sinful, is a feeling much too human, even borders on idolatry. Focus your vision outside yourself on the beauty, graciousness and compassion of Jesus. The pure of heart praise him from sunrise to sundown. Even when they feel broken, feeble, distracted, insecure and uncertain, they are able to release it into his peace". Brother Leo said: "Still, the Lord demands our effort and fidelity". "No doubt about that," replied Francis. "But holiness is not a personal achievement. It's an emptiness you discover in yourself. Instead of resenting it, you accept it and it becomes a free space where the Lord can create anew. And it doesn't come by our own efforts." "Then how?" Asked Leo. "Simply hoard nothing of vourself, sweep the house clean, even the painful memory of your past. Accept being broken. Renounce everything that is heavy, even the weight of your sins. See only the compassion, the infinite patience, and the tender love of Jesus. That suffices. You are no longer aware of yourself. Even the desire for holiness is transformed into a pure and simple desire for Jesus." May we all stand broken and joyful at the stable to Jesus who is enough!
