

This leads us to see how sacred the relationship of marriage is, for it is precisely as a matrimony that the relationship between Christ and His Church is described. So what happens when people judge the Church and

accuse her of evil and wrongdoing? What does that do to Christ? We cannot be friends of Christ and enemies of His bride. No amount of unfaithfulness among members of the Church can ever take away who the Church is as the chaste, holy, and undefiled bride of Christ. But even if we say to ourselves that we will therefore not say anything negative about the Church, but we wish to judge and condemn members of the Church, we are still in the wrong. Only God can judge: "Do not judge, lest you be judged" (Mt7:1). And also "unless you forgive your brother and sister from your heart, neither will your Heavenly Father forgive you" (Mt6:15). So, where do we stand before God? We stand as sinners in need of His mercy, and if we pretend to be blameless though we judge others, we will never enter the Kingdom of God. Our life, our goal, our entire purpose in this world is to serve God and to live in gratitude before God and one another. And when we encounter evil in our lives or in the lives of others, the answer is to lean into God and seek forgiveness, offer forgiveness, and move on. Jesus already showed us the way, he walked the way, all we have to do is follow. I pray that we will resist the temptation of the evil one towards anger, resentment and judgement. The Year of St. Joseph - On December 8 2020, Pope Francis declared a "**Year of St. Joseph**" marking the 150th Anniversary of the Proclamation of Saint Joseph as the Patron Saint of the Universal Church. This year continues until December 8, 2021, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception.

Although we read little about St. Joseph in the Bible, we know that he holds a central role in both the life of Jesus and in salvation history. In *Patris Corde*: With a Father's Heart, Pope Francis writes, "After Mary, the Mother of God,

no saint is mentioned more frequently in the papal magisterium than Joseph, her spouse." He is the Patron Saint of many – workers, fathers, travelers, unborn children, immigrants, dying a happy death and is the Patron Saint of Canada. His quiet strength and obedience serves as a model of faith for all.

In Patris Corde: With a Father's Heart, Pope Francis highlights seven characteristics of St. Joseph, each meant to inspire us to live our own faith more deeply by emulating his qualities. Pope Francis describes St. Joseph as a beloved, tender and loving, obedient, accepting, creatively courageous, working father and ultimately a father in the shadows. All the characteristics show us how Joseph loved Jesus - with a father's heart. By his loving devotion, he is both a model for Christian living and a visible sign of how God loves each of us. Pope Francis writes that, "The aim of this Apostolic Letter is to increase our love for this great saint, to encourage us to implore his intercession and to imitate his virtues and his zeal."
